## Trigger Action Plan Note #2: Applicable Locations

Trigger Action Plans (TAP) will be offered where the EIAR identifies a Significant Effect at a **non-residential receptor with special noise and vibration sensitivity**. The locations where TAPs are currently identified and offered to address site specific sensitivity are as follows:

- The Mater Misercordiae Hospital;
- The Rotunda Hospital;
- The Gate Theatre;
- The Ambassador Theatre;

- the National Museum of Archaeology;
- the Natural History Museum; •
- the Government Buildings complex; and •
- the Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine; and
- National Concert Hall. Leinster House;

Each TAP will be developed to be site specific and will include the following:

- The noise and vibration sensitivities of the premises, the activities that occur, the noise and vibration sensitive spaces (with reference to a site layout and floor plans), and the respective operating hours
- The project's site specific commitments in relation to the management of temporary construction noise and vibration effects associated with the construction of Metrolink
- The Trigger Action Levels (TALs) for each of the identified noise and vibration sensitive spaces
- The agreed actions/mitigation measures to be undertaken if the Trigger Action Levels are exceeded
- The noise and vibration monitoring to be undertaken throughout the duration of the construction works
- The engagement activities that will occur with the stakeholder throughout the construction period
- The TAP is 'live' document and will be maintained and implemented by the Contractor
