

Brian Boru House History

- Business has been carried on this historic site since early 1800's
- In the 1840's Mr Michael Keegan Master builder constructed the Victorian terrace of 6 houses that became known as Keegan's Buildings that ran down to and finished at The Brian Boru which he upgraded at the same time and created the façade that proudly stands to this day.
- In 1904 Patrick Hedigan from Galbally ,Co Limerick purchased The Brian Boru – this year marking the 120th anniversary of the Hedigan family's association with The Brian Boru.

Patrick established a very successful business which he operated until his death in 1939 when my father John then took over and continued to trade successfully for 34 years until his own death in 1973.

I myself joined the business in 1968 having worked previously in the summer holidays over the years as did my brothers and sisters

before and after me. Subsequently Peter joined the business in 1975.

- We are here today to record the contribution that The Brian Boru licensed premises has made to and continues to make to the Glasnevin area and its community over the last 2 centuries .
