

Dear Sir/Madam,

Firstly, we would like to state that we do not object to the MetroLink project which will provide much needed public transport links with the city centre. However, we do object to the destruction of the Markievicz Leisure Centre and 78 homes.

We are a mother and son who each use the swimming pool and gym 3-4 times weekly. It is a key part of our lifestyle. It was upgraded a few years ago and is very well run and a great amenity. We meet many regular users who either live or work locally. It is an especially important social space for older locals.

In a time of a housing crisis, it seems madness to demolish 78 homes which are in good condition. We are particularly concerned that alternatives to the demolition were not properly considered, with Transport Infrastructure Ireland stating from the outset that they would be demolished.

We are concerned that financial considerations are being put ahead of the needs of the city centre community.
