

To whom it may concern,

We are writing to make an objection in relation to the Metrolink proposed to be constructed under our property at 80 Botanic Road, Glasnevin, Dublin 9, land tag/reference number: ML4M-U32, area number 304. As the tunnel is proposed for under our property I believe we did not need to include the €50 fee as it is free of charge for us to make an objection.

We are very happy for the Metrolink station to be located nearby as it is a wonderful opportunity for our area. However, we do have some concerns in relation to its construction and the potential impact on businesses, residents and services in the surrounding area.

Our main concern is the schedule of works during construction, as we are located on Botanic Road and it will involve the movement of significant additional construction related traffic on the route to the Metro station site for a prolonged period of time. This traffic could seriously impact our quality of daily life and our quality of sleep at night, if the traffic and construction were permitted to take place 24 hours a day as it appears is being suggested in the plans. We are worried about vibration from this traffic and how this could affect our property, and the dust and pollution it will also cause. We have huge concerns over this as currently our road is very quiet in terms of traffic flow from 7pm onwards in the evening until 7.30am in the mornings. We suggest a residents monitoring group to keep an eye on this. We also would like to see a Community Fund is set up similar to the children's hospital fund

We are also concerned about our house as a structure and it's safety in terms of moving foundations or subsidence during the tunnelling out under our property and afterwards.
