
The Board will revert to you in due course with regard to the matter.

**Proposed Circular Economy Campus and Integrated Waste Management Facility
at Hollywood Co Dublin.**

We, Martin and Miriam Moore wish to lodge an objection to the above planning application.

We live and farm on the approach road to the above facility at Hollywood. My family have farmed here for the past two hundred years and depend on both clean air and water to enable our farming. This river rises at Knockbrack and flows in very close proximity to this facility.

Incinerator bottom ash is a source of leachate which is toxic. There is no way to guarantee that this leachate would not contaminate the most important and extensive groundwater aquifer in Leinster. Should the unthinkable happen and the ground water supplies get contaminated with pollutants who will take responsibility? Clean water is vital to our lives and the lives of our animals. Toxic airborne dust also puts our lives at risk.

Adjacent to our farm a new Primary School is being built, the traffic at the moment is horrendous and the additional heavy traffic, carrying hazardous toxic waste, to this facility would only make matters worse and could be detrimental to the children who attend this school and to the neighbourhood.

This site was found to be unsuitable by the EPA in 2014 and the site conditions have probably become more unsuitable since then so why should this application be considered.

In the current climate where a massive emphasis is being put on a clean sustainable environment we should not be putting our water and air at risk. Our clean water and air are far more important than any company Bank Balance.

Please take our objection into serious consideration.
