

Responses 1-3 and 5-8 are noted.

Response 4 to the question Have steel rod soil anchors been used to stabilise beneath similar properties (traditional brick built pitched roof 2-storey buildings? Are there alternative methods of stabilising railway embankments and if so, are they likely to cause less damage to similar properties such as the Gables? Are alternative options viable here?

Not for the first time CIÉ/IÉ has avoided answering the specific question whether steel rod anchors have been used to stabilise beneath similar properties (traditional brick built pitched roof 2-storey buildings). CIÉ/IÉ has not clarified to our satisfaction whether or not there are viable alternatives that would pose less of a threat to the Gables flat complex.
