

Re: DART+ South West Electrified Railway Order 2023

Dear Sir / Madam,

I am writing, as an affected property owner, in response to your correspondence received on the 16th March 2023 regarding the Railway Order in respect to the DART+ South West project.

From the information provided it appears that there will be impact on 8 Woodfield Avenue, which would involve the acquisition of a sub-stratum of land underneath the back garden. However, it is not known what the depth may be and greater detail of impact is not known from the information provided within the Railway Order.

Despite being in support of this much need investment in our transport infrastructure, I would like to submit my objection at this stage to the project as insufficient information and detail has been provided to potentially impacted property owners on the nature of the CPO required.

Further Detail on the Objection:

- Impact on my property No 8 Woodfield Avenue
- The ground anchors detailed in the railway order could potentially obstruct future development or damage existing structure within garden adjacent to the boundary of the property as the depth is not clear.
- There is Insufficient detail within the railway order in relation to vibration monitoring on properties which could
 cause ongoing or future damage My property is currently undergoing an extensive upgrade and renovation and
 I am concerned at possible damage to the newly laid foundations and structure.
- There are no plans to replace the wall to be demolished at the boundary of property with like for like original materials (stone and lime mortar) which would be damaging to the heritage of the area
- I am concerned about how sound levels will be monitored on an ongoing basis and how communities will be
 engaged with during the construction period. There is a lack of mitigation plans in the order on how impact will
 be minimised particularly for communities within close proximity of development, such as Woodfield.
- Further information is required on the scheduling of construction and how it could be sequenced so that work on the railway line behind Woodfield can be scheduled simultaneously for both sides of the line, with a view to minimising the timeline and levels of disruption on residents.

Disturbance during construction period

 The construction will take place at night time. This will disturb residents sleep for a prolonged period. Further mitigations are needed.

Permanent disturbance when construction is complete:

 With a higher frequency of trains, there likely will be increased disturbance ongoing and potential damage to structures with increased vibrations

Biodiversity Loss

I am also concerned by the level of bio diversity loss to the area that may be caused by this construction.
