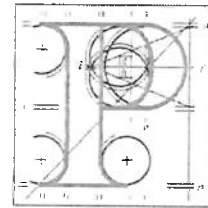

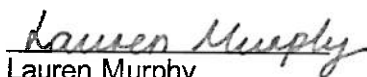

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to respond. Our main concern for Phase 3, is the issue of noise and vibration.

3. NOISE AND VIBRATION:

Question for Tokin's?

Why is it not possible for the Board to measure the noise level from my home.

Also, it states in the response that the guidelines used; namely "A Good Practice Guide to the Application of ETSU-R-97 for the Assessment and Rating of Wind Turbine Noise (2013) and the Wind Energy Development Guidelines for Planning Authorities, 2006". Both of these appear to me to be very outdated, considering the number of windfarms throughout the country. Is it not possible to use a more up-to-date system?

Phase 3 of the Dweninny Wind Farm Project, should not be allowed to request planning permission, as there was no consultation with locals, in relation to noise levels, even though this was requested on several occasions. In our opinion, this very important information should

be at the forefront, before any consideration should be given in relation to Phase 3.

No. 7 Shadow flicker
Question for Tobin's.

Please ask Tobin's to send on the exact details of the proposed technology that they intend to use to shut down turbines when my property is being affected by shadow flicker. They have just mentioned turbine shutdown mitigation measures, but no details of how they intend to achieve this are forthcoming, as it was a condition in the planning for Phase 1 + 2.

Thanks in advance for considering my genuine concerns, on this very big project.
