I would like to object to Case No 316178. On the ground of this area is over development there is large 29 turbines there since 2018 / 2019 and 21 small turbines already. They want to take down the 21 small turbines and put up 18 very large turbines in there place. As it is I can see all the turbines from ~~the~~ all the rooms in my front of my home. Since Owerinny wind farm started spinning in to 2019 we have had to put up noise day and night. The noise would get worst at night. We have had shadow flicker several times every year. Owerinny has not sorted out this problem to date. We also have shadow flicker from Phase 2 of the Owerinny wind farm since they started spinning late last year.

Everyone is happy to give wind farm planning permission but not one person cares about the people who have to live beside them. So from Phase 1 of the Oweninny wind farm we have shadow flicker in the morning and from Phase 2 we have it in the evening. They also want to build a synchronous condenser development in front of us.

- 1 This is a boggy area.
- 2 There are already 29 turbines which is causing a lot of trouble to local people/family. Noise and shadow flicker, deers, wild life, water and dust.
The small turbine never give any ~~any~~ trouble.
- 3 When ~~g~~ we get up in the morning we hear the noise from the turbines and we have ~~to~~ listen to them all day and they get worst at night. We could up a few times at night with the noise and they want to add more noise to it.
- * Deers are a big problem here we had no problem until BNM and ESB starting cut down trees to build these windfarms. The noise

from the wind farm is driving the deers out on to the roads in front of cars. There has been a good few accident with deers coming out in front of cars to date.

As it is we have 29 large turbines and 21 small turbines in front of my home and 31 turbines at the back of my house. This is too much turbines and there are 8 more turbines going up at the back of house not 5k away. If our county want to take down the small turbines we have to problem with that but not to put up larger one to replace them. Please do not give them to permission to make our lives worst than it is.
