

Section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended – Planning Application for a Wind Energy Development and Associated Works at the Ballivor Bog Group, County Meath and County Westmeath

Dear Sir/Madam,

I refer to correspondence received from consultants on behalf of Bord na Mona Powergen Limited on 6 April 2023 requesting comments from the Agency on a Section 37E¹ planning application and Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) for the above referenced development. The Agency makes the below observations.

The planning application documents for the proposed development refer to Integrated Pollution Control (IPC) Licence P0501-01 for the Derrygreenagh Bog Group, which in part comprises the Ballivor Bog Group. Bord na Mona Energy Limited was granted an IPC Licence (Register No: P0501-01) on 26 April 2000. The licence was granted for Class 1.4 of the First Schedule of the EPA Act 1992 'the extraction of peat in the course of business which involves an area exceeding 50 hectares' at Derrygreenagh Group, c/o Derrygreenagh Works, Rochfordbridge, Mullingar, County Westmeath.

Details of the licence (P0501-01) and any amendments made to the licence may be viewed on the Agency's website www.epa.ie. The licence may need to be reviewed or amended to accommodate the changes proposed in the planning application.

It is noted that the planning application is accompanied by an EIAR. As part of its consideration of any licence review application that may be received which addresses the changes proposed, the Agency shall ensure that before the revised licence is granted, the licence application will be made subject to an Environmental Impact Assessment as respects the matters that come within the functions of the Agency and in accordance with Section 83(2A) and Section 87(1G)(a) of the EPA Act. In addition, consultation on the licence application and EIAR will be carried out in accordance with Section 87 (1B) to (1H) of the EPA Act as appropriate. Please also note that you will be requested to provide the documentation relating to the EIA you have carried out to the Agency under Section 173A(4) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended.

Should a licence review application be received by the Agency, all matters to do with emissions to the environment from the activities proposed, the licence review application documentation and EIAR will be considered and assessed by the Agency.

Where the Agency is of the opinion that the activities, as proposed, cannot be carried on, or cannot be effectively regulated under a licence then the Agency cannot grant a licence for such an activity. Should the Agency decide to grant a licence in respect of the activity, as proposed, it will incorporate conditions that will ensure that appropriate National and EU standards are applied, and that Best Available Techniques (BAT) will be used in the carrying on of the activities.

Finally, please note that in accordance with Section 87(1D)(d) of the EPA Act, the Agency cannot issue a Proposed Determination on a licence application which addresses the development above until a planning decision has been made.

Section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended - Planning Application to An Bord Pleanála for a Wind Energy Development and Associated Works at the Ballivor Bog Group, County Meath and County Westmeath.

Dear Sir/Madam,

On behalf of our client, Bord na Môna Powergen Limited (the Applicant), please find enclosed a copy of a planning application for a renewable energy development in County Meath and County Westmeath. The Proposed Development consists of:

- The construction of 26 No. wind turbines and all associated hard-standing areas with the following parameters:
 - a. A total blade tip height of 200m,
 - b. Hub height of 115m, and
 - Rotor diameter of 170m.
- 2 No. permanent Meteorological Anemometry Masts with a height of 115 metres and associated hardstanding area and removal of existing meteorological mast.
- 4 No. temporary construction compounds with temporary site offices and staff facilities, in the townlands of Bracklin and Grange More.
- 5 No. temporary security cabins at the main construction site entrances and access points around the site, in the townland of Killagh, Grange More and Coolronan.
- 2 No. borrow pits located in the townlands of Grange More and Craddanstown and all works associated with the opening, gravel and spoil extraction, and decommissioning of the borrow pits.
- 1 No. permanent 110 kV electrical substation, which will be constructed in the townland of Grange More. The electrical substation will have 2 No. single storey control buildings, a 36 metre high telecom tower, associated electrical plant and equipment, a groundwater well and a wastewater holding tank.
- All associated underground electrical and communications cabling connecting the turbines and masts to the proposed electrical substation, including road crossings at R156 and a local vii. road between Lisclogher and Bracklin Bogs, and all works associated with the connection of the proposed wind farm to the national electricity grid, which will comprise connecting into the existing Mullingar - Corduff 110 kV overhead line that traverses the site.
- Provision of new internal site access tracks with passing bays measuring a total length of c. 28km and provision/upgrade of existing/new pathways for amenity uses measuring a total viii. length of c. 3.3km and associated drainage.



- Temporary accommodating works to existing public road infrastructure to facilitate delivery ix. of abnormal loads at locations on the R156 and R161 in the townlands of Doolystown and Moyfeagher;
- Accommodating works to widen existing site entrances off the R156 into Ballivor and Carranstown Bogs and reopen entrances at Lisclogher and Bracklin Bogs for use as construction site entrances and to facilitate delivery and movement of turbine components and construction materials; Entrances will be used for maintenance and amenity access during the operational period;
- Permanent vertical realignment of the R156 in the vicinity of the site entrance to achieve required sight lines.
- Construction of permanent site entrances off a local road into Lisclogher and Bracklin Bogs xii. to facilitate a crossing point for turbine components, construction materials and operation/amenity access;
- Provision of amenity access and amenity pathways using existing entrances off the R156 xiii. and local roads in the townlands of Bracklin, Coolronan, Clondalee More and Craddanstown:
- 3 No. permanent amenity carparks in Ballivor Bog (50 no. car parking spaces), Carranstown xiv. (15 no. car parking spaces) and Bracklin Bog (15 no. car parking spaces) and the provision of bicycle rack facilities at each location.
- All associated site works and ancillary development including access roads, drainage and XV. signage.
- A 10-year planning permission and 30-year operational life of the wind farm from the date xvi. of commissioning of the entire wind farm.

An Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) and Natura Impact Statement (NIS) have been prepared in relation to the project and accompany the planning application.

As the project requires an Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) the application has been notified to the EIA Portal. The EIA Portal ID is 2023049 and that the project details have been uploaded to the EIA Portal.

Submissions or observations may be made only to An Bord Pleanála (the Board) in writing or online at www.pleanala.ie, 64 Marlborough Street, Dublin 1 during the above-mentioned period of seven weeks relating to:

i. The implications of the proposed development for proper planning and sustainable development, and

ii. The likely effects on the environment of the proposed development, and

iii. The likely effects of the proposed development on a European site, if carried out.

Any submissions/observations must be accompanied by a fee of €50 (except for certain prescribed bodies) and must be received by the Board not later than 5.30 p.m. on the 2nd of June 2023. Such submissions/observations must also include the following information:

The name of the person making the submission or observation, the name of the person acting on his or her behalf, if any, and the address to which any correspondence relating to the application should be sent,

The subject matter of the submission or observation, and

> The reasons, consideration and arguments on which the submission or observation is based in full (Article 217 of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001, as amended, refers)

Any submissions or observations which do not comply with the above requirements cannot be considered by the Board.

The Board may at its absolute discretion hold an oral hearing on the application (refer to 'A Guide to Public Participation in Strategic Infrastructure Development' at www.pleanala.ie). The Board may in respect of an application for permission decide to:

- (i) grant the permission, or (a)
 - (ii) make such modifications to the proposed development as it specifies in its decision and grant permission in respect of the proposed development as so modified, or
 - (iii) grant permission in respect of part of the proposed development (with or without specified modifications of the foregoing kind), and any of the above decisions may be subject to or without conditions, or
- Refuse to grant the permission **(b)**

A person may question the validity of any such decision of the Board by way of an application for judicial review, under Order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (S.I. No. 15 of 1986, as amended
