

Dear Sir/Madam,

I, Father Dan Dunne, Parish Priest of Ballyadams Parish Co. Laois, write in connection with the above listed planning application. As a Parish Priest of Ballyadams Parish which includes the areas of Wolfhill, Luggacurren & Timahoe, I wish to object to the proposed development by Statkraft.

Whilst I share many of the concerns as have been raised by local residents to these two projects, my particular concern relates to the impact that this industrial scale development would have on the tranquil, sensitive and sacred settings of the parish's churches and associated burial grounds and in particular, those located at Wolfhill, Luggacurren.

I am not satisfied that the proposed development will not seriously injure the environmental amenities of the area and impact severely on residential and church properties and detract from the visual amenities. It would therefore be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of this area.

I respectfully urge that planning permission for this development be refused.
