Dear Secretary,

We wish to submit a strong objection to the above project.

Our farm is in Bleantasour next to two neighbouring farms that are involved in the proposed wind farm project. We also farm in Kilbrien where our home is. We strongly oppose this development, which is seeking a 10-year planning permission and 40-year operational request. I believe it would have a detrimental impact on our livelihood as we also have an Agricultural Contracting business.

Construction Phase

The impact of the increase of construction traffic on any of our rural road networks would have catastrophic effect on our daily lives. We need to commute daily sometimes on multiple occasions to our farm in Bleantasour to take care of our animals. People need to get to their work place. Farmers need to have their milk collected.

Our Agricultural Contracting Business is extremely weather dependent.

The proposed development threatens to disrupt our ability to reach the farmers in a timely manner. Increased traffic and congestion in the area could make it difficult for us to transport our equipment and machinery to the farms.

If there was a critical incident, emergency services getting to the area has not been addressed, and more importantly the over-all consideration to the residents of the area is not conglomerate to the level of risk.

The L1041 is a local road connecting the R672 at Beary's Cross with Kilbrien and has numerous sharp bends at the best of times two cars will manage to pass each other on this road but nothing larger. The local people use this road to access the R672.

The proposed access for the construction traffic of the Meteorological Mast are travelling down the L1041 turning left at Scart Bridge onto the L1042 that is the Comeragh Drive. On meeting a junction to your left that is a continuation of the Comeragh Drive, you proceed straight ahead onto the L5116 this continues on to the L51162 straight to Coumnagappul where the road ends. Our roads do not have the capacity to take extra traffic. This is also option C for the underground cable grid link.

Scart Bridge which is of Vernacular heritage and is a protected structure RPS Number: WA751041 c1820 described as (A well-proportioned bridge forming an appealing landmark on the river Colligan. The rubble stone work serves to blend the bridge into the surrounding landscape, while the civil engineering heritage significance of the site is identified by the Construction).

The studies have failed to include the fact that Scart Bridge is Protected.

The further omission of acknowledging that the L1042 that goes through the bridge is a continuation of the Comeragh Drive referring to it as an unnamed road.

The L51162 is referred to as **An Agricultural Track** that goes through unregistered land. This section of unregistered land is part of Bleantasour Mountain commonage that we hold rights in common with other local farmers. We most definitely will not enter into any agreement that involves Bleantasour Mountain or any part of our property to facilitate this Industrial Development. How can this be part of the planning application without consultation with the other rights in common holders?

Another major omission is the absence of Kilbrien National School from the **Schools Located Near Wind Farm Site** it being a mere 4km from the site.





As you can see above one report states in the Foothills and the other states in the Upland?


I would like to enquire as to why there is no Addendum B?

It is a requirement of the Applicant to erect a site notice in all areas where works are proposed. A site notice was not erected on the R672, Clooncogaile Cross Roads.

I would like to point out to the Board there is an omission of a signature on the letters of consent. "Paddy Coffey of Knockavannia, Ballymacarbry, Co. Waterford" has not signed the letter of consent.

The 1^{st} Meteorological mast was in situ on the 15^{th} June 2019 in Carrigbrack. A retention planning application was lodged with Waterford City and County Council on the 17^{th} June 2021. Ref no: 21565. The decision date was 11^{th} August 2021. It was withdrawn on 10^{th} August 2021.

The 2nd Meteorological mast was in situ on the 14th September 2021 in Coumnagappul erected by Met Com There were two masts without planning.

I refer to case Referral No.PLO5E.RL.3419 Planning Authority Reference: PS5/15/01

Details of Reference: Whether the erection of 2 no. Wind monitoring masts is or is not exempted development. The inspectors report: States An Bord Pleanála, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 5 (3) (a) of the 2000 Act, hereby decides that the said erection of multiple masts for mapping meteorological conditions in a site is not exempted development.

On the 5th November 2021. Ref no:211029 The 1st Meteorological mast was in for retention once again with Waterford City and County Council. The application was finalised on the 8th January 2022. EMPower said the Mast was not theirs.

While looking through the planning document Appendix 11.2 General Geotechnical site photos I came to page 7 above and as you can see from the picture above they refer to "at turbine T02 view existing met mast" this is the 2nd mast in question in the col to the east of Milk Hill.

The first mast that was in Carrigbrack was dismantled and removed by Met Com in late January 2023 and the second mast followed subsequently in 2023.

Both masts were subject to Unauthorised Developments.

Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028 has deemed the area of the proposed Coumnagappul Wind Farm as an Exclusion Zone for Wind Farm Development.

The Elected Members of Waterford City and County Council adopted the Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028 at the full Council Meeting held on Tuesday 7th June 2022 and it came into effect on Tuesday 19th July 2022.

Planning applications are expected to provide a comprehensive and accurate assessment of the potential impacts of a proposed development. However, when significant omissions are discovered in a planning application, it raises serious doubts about the credibility and reliability of the combined studies.

A lot of this application is based on assumptions so how are An Bord Pleanála supposed to make a decision without precise information.

We respectfully request you take our grave concerns into account and protect our democracy by upholding The Waterford City and County Development Plan.
