Re: Planning Application for the development of a Wind Farm Consisting of 10 turbines and associated works

To whom this may concern,

As elected representatives of the Waterford City and County Council we wish to highlight our grave concerns in relation to PA93. 318446, the proposed construction of Coumnagappul Wind Farm consisting of 10 no. turbines and associated infrastructure.

First and foremost, it is essential that An Bord Pleanála note that the area in question is designated as an exclusion zone for Wind Farm Development in the Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028. The Comeragh Mountains which is home to the renowned Mahon Falls and Comeragh Drive, is one of Waterford's oldest tourist attractions, with unspoiled beauty and a wide variety of flora and fauna. We believe that this wind farm, with imposing monstrosities of 185m high, would destroy the beautiful scenery and the tourist attraction to the area. We would also like to note that there are currently plans in place to develop off-shore wind farms off the entire Waterford coastline, which the people of Waterford have been very receptive of. Waterford was recently named in the New York Times '52 places to go list for 2024' with references made to 'Waterford's natural riches' which no doubt includes the Comeragh mountain range.

The proposed site is at the heart of the Comeragh Mountains, an area rated most sensitive in landscape sensitivity rating of Waterford City and County Council development plan. It is an area of unspoilt beauty. It has no pre-existing infrastructure whatsoever to support this industrial sized development. The road leading to this site is part of the Comeragh Drive L1042 which is one of Waterford's oldest tourist attractions (4.5 star rating on Trip Advisor). The narrow road meanders through the rugged mountain where one can admire the unspoilt flora and fauna. At the best of times, two cars would just about pass each other on these roads. The area is rich in history, and we would note that scart bridge where the road links to the proposed development is a protective structure as per Waterford City and County heritage program (number wa751040). This road network would not be capable of accommodating the heavy construction traffic associated with this development and would pose a safety risk to residents and tourists alike.

Although the application makes reference to six school, they failed to mention the local national school in Kilbrien which is only 3k from the proposed wind farm.

This proposed wind farm is casing a lot of distress to the local people with the fear of losing their sense of serenity and privacy. We believe that it is very unfair for large companies to come in and destroy our sparsely populated, untouched natural landscape. As strong advocates for mental and suicide awareness we can see the impact that this proposal is having on local residents, causing undue stress. The loss of a peaceful and harmonious environment can disrupt the sense of security and stability that is crucial for maintaining a healthy state of mind. In turn this can lead to feelings of displacement and detachment from the place they call home.

Ten-year planning permission has been sought and a staggering forty year operational effectively wiping out a whole generation. We hope this letter evidently displays our deep concerns in relation to PA93. 318446, the proposed construction of Coumnagappul Wind Farm, please take these concerns into consideration.
