

Dear Sir/Madam,

We wish to submit a strong objection in relation to the Strategic Infrastructure Development application for Coumnagappul Wind Farm, lodged on the 13/11/2023 to An Bord Pleanála Case reference: PA93.318446.

I am writing this submission to express my concerns and objections regarding the proposed wind farm in the Comeragh Mountains. Our family home is in Lackendarra, and our local road number is L1041. We specifically chose this site for its picturesque location, as it offers stunning views of the unspoilt Comeragh Mountains. However, if this planning permission is granted this industrial sized Wind Farm will be towering over us due to its elevated site.

One of our main concerns is that we were not consulted at any stage of the planning process. We believe that as residents in close proximity to the proposed site, our opinions and concerns should have been taken into account. Additionally, we were excluded from the visualisations, which further adds to our frustration and feeling of being disregarded.

Another issue we have is the proposed construction traffic exit route. According to the plans, the construction traffic would pass through our local Scart Bridge, which is a protected structure. However, it was omitted from the list of protected structures provided by the developers. This raises questions about the thoroughness and accuracy of their planning process.

Furthermore, we noticed a significant omission in the Preliminary Traffic Management Plan.

In section 3.3, Table 3-2, which lists schools located near the wind farm site, Kilbrien National School, which is only 4km away, was not included. It is perplexing why such an omission would occur, especially considering that the list includes six other schools ranging from 7.2 Km to 15.8 Km.

The Waterford City and County Development Plan 2022-2028 has deemed the area of the proposed Wind Farm as a No Go Zone for Wind Farm Development. We need to protect our democracy.

In conclusion, we strongly oppose the granting of planning permission for the proposed wind farm in the Comeragh Mountains. We believe that our concerns as residents have not been adequately addressed, and the omission of important factors such as our proximity to the site and the impact on local schools raises doubts about the thoroughness and reliability of these Consultants.

We ask An Bord Pleanála to refuse this application, to uphold our recently adopted Development Plan and take into account the concerns of the local community.
