Dear Sir/Madam,

I refer to the request for planning permission for the above development, details of which were received by the Irish Aviation Authority directly from the applicant.

It is the observation of the Irish Aviation Authority that the applicant should be required to engage with the Air Navigation Service Provider (ANSP) AirNav Ireland, daa Cork Airport and Waterford Airport to undertake a preliminary screening assessment to confirm that the proposed wind farm and the associated cranes that would be utilised during its construction would have no impact on instrument flight procedures, communication and navigation aids or flight checking at either Cork Airport or Waterford Airport.

In the event of planning consent being granted, the applicant should be conditioned to contact the Irish Aviation Authority to:

- (1) agree an aeronautical obstacle warning light scheme for the wind farm development,
- (2) provide as-constructed coordinates in WGS84 format together with ground and tip height elevations at each wind turbine location and
- (3) notify the Authority of intention to commence crane operations with at least 30 days prior notification of their erection.
