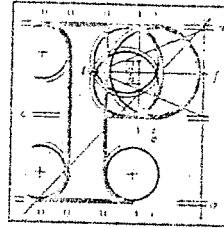

**Subject: Objection to Planning Application PA04.318802 – Waste to Energy Facility, Ringaskiddy, Co. Cork**

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to lodge a formal objection to the proposed development of a waste to energy facility in Ringaskiddy, County Cork, under planning application reference number PA04.318802.

Along with the points below we are also for are own health and family who live in the crosshaven, Myrtiville and carrigaline area. But most are youngest daughter who as a very low Immune system as she has kidney diseases, this would add to her already challenging health conditions. For the points below and this reason stated I hope you will not allow such planning to be approved, that will affect so many vulnerable people already suffering. My grounds for objection are based on the following concerns:

- **Public Health:** I am deeply concerned about the potential risks to public health from the proposed facility. Independent planning inspectors have previously expressed concern that there is not sufficient evidence to prove the development would not pose risks to the public. The potential for the release of toxic emissions, such as dioxins and furans, is a significant worry, as these can be harmful to health and can accumulate through the food chain.
- 
- **Environmental Impact:** The proposed incinerator will have a significant and lasting impact on the local environment, including the marine environment and local wildlife. The formation of dioxins and furans at temperatures between 500°C and 800°C raised to the composed with power 800°C is a significant concern, and the ability of the facility to consistently maintain temperatures above 800°C raised to the composed with power 800°C needs to be rigorously assessed.
- **Sustainable Development:** The construction of a new incinerator contravenes the principles of sustainable development. Incineration should not be the primary method for waste management; a properly structured system should prioritize reduction, reuse, and recycling, viewing "waste" as a resource.
- **Traffic and Infrastructure:** The incinerator will lead to a significant increase in road traffic in the area. The local roads are already in poor condition and not designed to handle such heavy, continuous traffic.

- **Impact on Community and Mental Health:** The significant change to our local environment and the visual impact of the facility will negatively affect the aesthetic character of our community. Furthermore, the constant disruption and potential health risks will likely have a detrimental impact on the mental health of residents.

I request that you give these grounds for objection due consideration during your deliberations. I have Paid the required fee of €50.

I reserve the right to make further submissions should an oral hearing take place.
