

I would like to make an observation on the proposed Ummamore Wind Farm, case reference number 316051.

I live within the 2km radius to this proposed development and I would like to object to this development going ahead.

I have serious concerns over the construction of this development as I live within the 2km radius.

There will be serious disruption to my local road during this proposed construction phase with huge Volumes of Concrete and steel to be imported onto the site for construction. This is a quite rural area and roads not fir for such a huge scale of condtruction.

Many local homes will be exposed to shadow flicker. My house number is 97 on the final map submitted by developer but this does not match on previous shadow flicker maps which had my house at number 90.

Infrasound

Noise: This is a quite rural area and there will be noise pollution by these industrial turbines.

Turbine Height: Turbines 185m high will dominate the local landscape and skyline.

Impact on wildlife if this development goes ahead. Other studies have shown where there are windfarms there are no birds.

The current Irish planning guidelines for wind farms rely on a UK noise assessment model that dates from 1996. This is not fit for purpose in the light of the vast increase in turbine size since then.

SEAI Wind atlas reports low average wind speed for this proposed site. In 2021 and 2022 a wind monitoring mast erected by the developer collapsed on two occasions.
