Dear Sir/Madam

**Ecopower Developments (EDL)** intends to carry out the approved UWF Grid Connection SID development and herein requests that the Board exercises its powers under Section 146B of the Planning & Development Act, 2000, as amended, to alter the terms of the development, which was approved by the Board on 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021. Ref. ABP-306204.19.

The approved but not yet built, UWF Grid Connection consists of a proposed new 110kV substation at Mountphilips, Newport, County Tipperary and 30km of underground 110kV cabling and ancillary works (UGC), of which 6.3km of the UGC route is particular to this Alteration Request. The UGC will connect the new substation at Mountphilips to the authorised Upperchurch Windfarm Substation at Knockcurraghbola, Upperchurch, County Tipperary and will facilitate the export of electricity from Upperchurch Windfarm to the National Grid. UWF Grid Connection and Upperchurch Windfarm (collectively the Upperchurch Windfarm Project) are both Strategic Infrastructure Developments. The Upperchurch Windfarm Project is not yet constructed.

Ecopower Developments Limited (EDL) is a related company to Upperchurch Windfarm Limited. These companies are the developers of the Upperchurch Windfarm Project.

This Alteration Request relates to two (2) proposed alterations to the terms of the UWF Grid Connection development namely

- 1. Alterations to the route of a section of the underground grid cable (UGC) route around Newport and alterations to the crossing methodology of bridges both in the vicinity of Newport and along the Thurles to Limerick Regional Road (R503), and
- 2. A request to include a condition for a 10-year appropriate period, during which the development can be constructed. This is required due to the nature of the development.

## 1. Alteration Request No. 1

## 1.1 Introduction to Alteration Request No. 1

Alteration Request No. 1 relates to the 30km of 110kV underground grid connection cabling and associated joint bays and ancillary works (herein called the UGC) which is one part of the UWF Grid Connection development, authorised by the Board under Ref. ABP-306204.19. The UGC links Mountphilips Substation to Upperchurch Windfarm Substation. With the exception of both ends of the UGC (Mountphilips Substation and Upperchurch Windfarm Substation ends), the route of the UGC is authorised for installation in the public road including crossing bridges along the route.

In addition to planning authorisation for the UGC, the developer of the UGC works must also apply to the Commission for Regulation of Utilities (CRU) under Section 48 of the Electricity Regulation Act 1999 (as amended), for consent to exercise the powers conferred on the ESB under Section 51 and Section 52(1) of the Electricity (Supply) Act 1927 (as amended), to lay electric lines under a road. This consent was granted to Upperchurch Windfarm Limited under CRU Ref. D/22/17942 on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2022. Upperchurch Windfarm Limited is an authorised undertaker under CRU Ref. AUTH 2017/10-01 (a) which is a prerequisite to the granting of the Section 48 by the CRU. Included in the CRU consent letter to Upperchurch Windfarm Limited is a requirement that a valid Road Opening Licence must be obtained from the Roads Management Office (RMO) prior to commencing works.

Therefore, in accordance with the CRU consent, a Road Opening Licence must be secured in order to carry out the UGC works. The RMO will issue the licence once the terms of the Licence which include construction methodologies, are agreed beforehand with the Roads Authority, in this case Tipperary County Council.

In order to progress the UWF Grid Connection development to construction, in 2022 EDL commenced consultation with Tipperary County Council, Roads Section (the Council) on the terms and methodologies of the laying of the UGC under the public road between the Mountphilips Substation and the Windfarm Substation, including within the decking of bridges along the route. Placement of cabling within the bridge decking, i.e. between the top of the arch stones and the road surface, is the authorised methodology for the UGC and this was the norm at the time of the UWF Grid Connection application in 2019. Since 2022, there have been several meetings regarding the Road Opening Licence between the Council and EDL, which included attendances and contributions from ESB Networks and EDL's electrical and civil contractors. The Council's conclusion from the meetings was that, whilst they wished to support the Upperchurch Windfarm Project and for this reason gave permission in principle to apply for cables to be placed under the public road in 2019, since then the knowledge, principles and understanding of all stakeholders in this area has been evolving. The Council's



concern about the UGC works is the proposal to lay the UGC within the decking of the stone arch bridges along the route and therefore the Council requires that EDL does not install the UGC within the decking of these bridges, but that these bridge crossings be constructed using an alternative methods such as by-passing the bridges by exiting the road for short sections and placing the UGC in lands adjacent to the bridges or alternatively, directionally drilling below the bridge structure.

The proposed alterations to the authorised UGC crossing methodology at bridges, which is required in order to agree on the Road Opening Licence terms with the Council, is the subject of this Alteration Request No. 1.

## 1.2 Details of Alteration Request No. 1

In order to comply with the County Council requests, EDL commenced examining alternative methodologies for crossing the bridges in question.

There are 4 No. bridges B1 B2 B3 and B4, between Mountphilips Substation and the junction with the R503 Regional Road east of Newport. Two of these bridges B1 and B2 are authorised to cross within the bridge deck and B3 and B4 are authorised for directional drill method. The Council has requested that B1 and B2 are crossed using an alternative method e.g. by directional drilling or crossing in the stream bed utilising the dam and overpump method.

The alternatives to crossing bridges B1, B2, B3 and B4 is set out in Table 1 below.

There are a further eleven bridges along the R503 (B5, B6, B7, B8, B9, B10, B11, B12, B13, B14 and B15), where it is also authorised to cross within the bridge deck. This method is not acceptable to the Council for six of the bridges namely B5, B9, B10, B11, B14 and B15. Bridges B5, B9, B11 and B14 are suitable for the dam and overpump method. Bridge B15 will require directional drilling. Bridge B10 is a masonry stone slab (clapper bridge) and the Council are agreeable to directional drilling or replacement of the clapper bridge with a culvert, whichever is indicated at the time of construction. Additionally, the Council has agreed that B8, B12 and B13 have sufficient cover to allow the authorised method of crossing within the deck of the bridge, to be carried out. Bridges B6 and B7 also have deep cover but the Council require the results of a full structural assessment of the capacity of the bridge to accommodate the concrete beam encasing the cables, before it will decide if crossing within the deck is acceptable or whether directional drilling is required. The methodology will be decided during the finalisation of the terms of the Road Opening Licence.

The proposed methods for crossing bridges B5, B6, B7, B8, B9, B10, B11, B12, B13, B14 and B15 are set out in Table 1 below.



The crossing methods set out in Table 1 included input from a directional drilling contractor, the project civils and electrical contractors, ESB Networks, the project ecology consultants with input from the National Parks and Wildlife Service and Inland Fisheries Ireland and cultural heritage consultants. All these consultees carried out field visits to inspect the sites where alternatives are requested.

The Schedule 7A information/Assessment (attached as Appendix 4) submitted with this S146B request evaluates the impact of the alternative route and methodology options for Bridges B1, B2, B3, B4, B5, B6, B7, B9, B10, B11, B14 and B15. The Council is agreeable to Bridges B8, B12 and B13 being crossed as authorised.

#### 1.3 Consultations with Stakeholders

Landowners of the off-road lands now proposed for alternative routes and bridge crossing methodologies were consulted and they have given their consent to make this Alteration Request. See Landowner Consent Letters attached as Appendix 2

National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS); Inland Fisheries Ireland (IFI), the grid operator ESB Networks and Tipperary County Council were consulted on the proposed alterations. The substance of the consultations with NPWS and IFI is set out in the Schedule 7A information/Assessment attached as Appendix 4 (Section 1.3)



## 1.4 Construction Methodologies; Mitigation and Best Practice Measures

The Environmental Management Plan for the authorised development includes

- Construction Methodologies for pre-construction activities including ecological confirmatory surveys; cable trenching; instream watercourse crossing works including dam and overpump methods; directional drilling works; replacement of culverts during construction; and construction of access roads.
- Mitigation Measures for works within agricultural, forestry and riparian lands to protect ecology (including the Hen Harrier in situ and ex-situ the Slieve Felim to Silvermines Mountain SPA and Otter), protect water quality (including of the Lower River Shannon SAC) and to protect archaeology (including sub-surface archaeology), and
- Best Practice Measures to protect water quality and prevent flood risk during construction.

The Requested Alterations which entail additional works in agricultural and forestry lands, additional instream works and additional directional drilling works, will be undertaken under the same Construction Methodologies, Mitigation Measures and Best Practice Measures which were submitted as part of the Environmental Management Plan, for the authorised development.

#### 1.5 Conclusion to Alteration Request No. 1

In conclusion, EDL requests that Alteration Request No. 1 as set out in Table 1 above, be granted in the context of;

- The requirement to secure a Road Opening Licence for the UGC route under the terms of the Section 48 consent from the CRU to lay the UGC under the road,
- Tipperary County Council's request for alterations to the methodology of crossing bridges along the public road route of the UGC,
- The requirement to agree the terms of the Road Opening Licence with Tipperary County Council prior to the Roads Management Office (RMO) issuing the Licence,
- The nature of the UGC, being an underground installation,
- The proposed new route around Newport avoids 4 No. bridges completely and reduces the length of the UGC route along public roads by circa 4km,
- The Construction Methodologies proposed herein (directional drilling, dam and overpump method) have already been authorised for other watercourse crossings in the development,



- The Mitigation Measures and Best Practice Measures that are already authorised for all the relevant Construction Methodologies will also be carried out for the Alterations,
- As demonstrated in the Schedule 7A Information and assessment, the Alterations do not have the potential to have a significant impact on the environment or human health.



## 2. Alteration Request No. 2

Alteration No. 2 is a request that a planning condition be included in the terms of the UWF Grid Connection development (ABP-306204.19) that confirms that the appropriate period during which time the development can be completed is 10-years from the date of the Board Order i.e. to 8<sup>th of</sup> February 2031. An appropriate period of 10-years was proposed and advertised in the Public Notices and in the Planning Application Form for the subject development in 2019.

## 2.1 Details of Alteration Request No. 2

There is no appropriate period specified during which the development can be constructed in the Board Order dated 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021 for UWF Grid Connection (ABP-306204-19).

It is requested herein that the following condition be included in the terms of the UWF Grid Connection development;

The period during which the proposed development hereby permitted may be carried out shall be 10- years from the date of this Order.

**Reason**: Having regard to the nature of the proposed development, the Board considered it appropriate to specify a period of validity of this permission in excess of five years.

EDL submits that a 10-year period for UWF Grid Connection development is appropriate because;

- The public was given notice at the planning application stage for the subject UWF Grid Connection development (ABP-306204-19), that the application was for an appropriate period of 10-years (varied from 5 years) during which the permission was to have effect, having regard to the nature and extent of this development. This period for the development was advertised to the public through Site Notices, Newspaper Notices, the Planning Application Form, notice on the EIA Portal and in a notice to Prescribed Bodies before submission of the application. See the UWF Grid Connection planning application Public and Prescribed Bodies Notices attached as Appendix 3.
- UWF Grid Connection is part of the whole Upperchurch Windfarm Project which includes Upperchurch Windfarm. Upperchurch Windfarm (amended) was granted permission by Board Order dated 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022 (ABP-310171-21), wherein Condition 3 states that the appropriate period is 10-years from the date of the Order,
- The two main elements of the Upperchurch Windfarm Project UWF Grid Connection and Upperchurch Windfarm (amended) are interconnected and will be constructed at the same time with a projected construction period of circa. 18 months from commencement of construction.



- Having regard to the nature and extent of the UWF Grid Connection construction period where i) two substations must be constructed and commissioned and 30km of ducting and cabling must be installed, ii) where grid outages from ESB Networks are required to be scheduled during the commissioning phase of the development iii) where there are long lead times for major items of electrical plant and equipment necessary for the construction of the UGC and iv) where the UGC part of the development requires that a Road Opening Licence is secured. All of these items can take considerable time to close out. In that context a 10-year period from the date of the Order would be appropriate,
- In the Upperchurch Windfarm (amended) planning application 2021 (ABP-310171-21), the cumulative effects of Upperchurch Windfarm in combination with UWF Grid Connection are assessed within the EIA Report and AA Report submitted. A finding of no significant effects on the environment or on designated sites was concluded in these reports and the Board agreed with these conclusions in their EIA and AA for the development. The Board granted a period of 10-years, during which the permission for Upperchurch Windfarm (amended) is to have effect,
- The Upperchurch Windfarm Project has been included in the Government's latest renewable energy support scheme RESS4. Under the terms of the scheme the development must be constructed and commissioned by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2029.
- The desirability of wind energy developments in the context of the government's obligations under the latest Climate Action Plan 2024 (CAP24) to meet national climate objectives of 80% renewable electricity (RE-E) on the grid, by 2030.

In the above listed contexts, a period of 10-years during which the permission is to have effect for the UWF Grid Connection development, would be appropriate and will facilitate the building out of the Upperchurch Windfarm project within the relevant project planning deadlines.



## 3. Planning Statement

In summary, this is an Application under S.146B of the Planning & Development Act, 2000 (as amended), to alter the terms of the UWF Grid Connection development as approved by Board Order dated 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021. ABP-306204.19. The Requested Alterations relate to;

Alteration Requests No. 1: Alterations to the route of a section of the underground grid cable (UGC) route around Newport and alterations to the crossing methodology of bridges both in the vicinity of Newport and along the Thurles to Limerick Regional Road (R503). These Alterations are required in order to agree the terms of the Road Opening Licence with Tipperary County Council Roads Section, whose preference is to avoid cabling being installed within the decking of selected bridges and that these bridges would instead be crossed by another method. It is herein requested that alterations be allowed in order to a) alter the authorised UGC route around Newport to avoid 4 No. bridges by diverting off-road into agricultural lands, farm tracks and Local Roads and creating a new crossing point for the Newport (aka Mulkear) and Small Rivers where directional drill is possible and, b) to change the authorised methodology for the UGC installation in certain bridges along the R503, to directional drill or dam and overpump methods as indicated.

<u>Alteration Request No. 2:</u> To include a condition for a 10-year appropriate period, during which the development can be constructed. This is required in order to allow sufficient time to construct the development.

#### 3.1 Statement on Effects of the Alterations

EDL is applying to the Board to exercises its powers under Section 146B of the Planning & Development Act, 2000, as amended, to grant the Requested Alterations No. 1 and No. 2 to the terms of the UWF Grid Connection development.

The Requested Alterations do not have the potential to have a significant impact on the environment or human health. The Schedule 7A Information/Assessment document submitted and evaluations therein, supports the statement of no significant effect. The Schedule 7A Information/Assessment covers all topics examined in the UWF Grid Connection development EIAR 2019. The Schedule 7A Information/Assessment includes an examination of all the environmental topics for potential for effects from the Requested Alterations. Where there is potential to have some effects, namely Water, Biodiversity and Cultural Heritage additional studies and assessment were carried out. Desktop and field surveys were conducted to establish the current baseline environment. In relation to Water and Biodiversity, on-site consultations with both Inland Fisheries Ireland (IFI) and the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) were also conducted.



In the context of the wider climate action effects of a grant of the Requested Alterations, wind energy supplied 32% of Ireland's electricity in 2024 (Wind Energy Ireland 2025), which is under half of the Climate Action Plan (CAP24) target of 80% renewable electricity by 2030. The latest National Energy Projections Report 2024 (SEAI, November 2024) states that "there is a risk of delayed achievement across a range of Climate Action Plan targets, including for renewable electricity and if even some of these risks materialise, it would result in target failure, increased greenhouse gas emissions and less renewable energy. Actions to address these risks are critically important". A grant of the Requested Alterations will allow the construction of the Upperchurch Windfarm project to begin without delay, as all the other permits and requirements for the whole project are now in place. Upperchurch Windfarm is a large windfarm of 84MW installed capacity and is a significant part of the Government's RESS4 scheme. RESS4 is a pivotal component of the Government of Ireland's Climate Action Plans and efforts to achieve a target of at least 80% renewable electricity by 2030.

I refer to Upperchurch Windfarm Limited's application to the Commission for Regulation of Utilities (CRU) under section 48 of the *Electricity Regulation Act 1999*, as amended (the "1999 Act") for consent to exercise the powers conferred on the ESB under section 51 and section 52(1) of the *Electricity (Supply) Act 1927*, as amended.

Due to the replacement of Auth 2017/10-01, dated 9 August 2018 with Auth 2017/10-01(a), dated 8 December 2021, the CRU revokes its consent issued on 24 June 2021 with reference D/21/14631 and is now issuing this consent in its place.

The CRU has granted Upperchurch Windfarm Limited an Authorisation to Construct or Reconstruct a Generating Station under section 16 of the 1999 Act – this authorisation being a pre-requisite for the section 48 consent.

In relation to this section 48 consent application, the CRU understands the following:

- this consent only applies to the section of the grid connection to be laid under the public road as indicated in the application.
- that the application for these powers is for the purpose of the contestable build of a 110kV underground cable, 30.5km in length, to connect the Upperchurch Windfarm located at Knockcurraghbola Commons, Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary to a substation at Knockcurraghbola Commons, Milestone, Co. Tipperary;
- that a valid Road Opening Licence will be obtained prior to commencing works;
- 4. that Upperchurch Windfarm Limited will transfer ownership of the contestably built connection to ESB Networks.

Furthermore, the CRU expects that Upperchurch Windfarm Limited will exercise its powers under section 48 of the 1999 Act, in a proportionate and reasonable manner. Upperchurch Windfarm Limited should also ensure that it conforms to industry best practice when exercising these powers.



In consideration of all of the above, pursuant to section 48 of the 1999 Act, I am writing to advise you that the CRU consents to the exercising by Upperchurch Windfarm Limited of the powers conferred on the ESB by section 51 and section 52(1) of the *Electricity (Supply) Act 1927, as amended* subject to a valid Road Opening Licence being in place.

This consent is being granted for the purposes of the contestable build of a 110kV underground cable, 30.5km in length, to connect the Upperchurch Windfarm located at Knockcurraghbola Commons, Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary to a substation at Knockcurraghbola Commons, Milestone, Co. Tipperary and may not be used for any other purposes.

This consent will remain valid until the earlier of:

- The date that the contestable construction of the grid connection for the development of a generation station is commissioned; or
- The date that the Connection Agreement is terminated for the development of a generation station.

The CRU may revoke a consent that has been granted to you if material inaccuracies relative to the information you provided are found.
