RIGHTSIZING SCHEME ONE-BED GROUND FLOOR & FIRST FLOOR HOMES AVAILABLE IN RADHARC CILLÍN, LIMERICK



Are you a homeowner over the age of 55 and find your house too large for your needs? Limerick City and County Council may be able to help.

Limerick City and County Council is launching a new Rightsizing Scheme at Radharc Cillín, Kiltmore, Co. Limerick. The register launch is focused on private rightsholders over the age of 55, who own their own home, and who find their dwelling too large for their needs. Under the scheme, a successful applicant must sell their home on the private market in return for a lifetime tenancy. The successful applicants will pay a 25% financial contribution to Limerick City and County Council.

The new Rightsizing homes at Radharc Cillín, Kiltmore, Co. Limerick are one-bed ground and first floor homes with floor areas of 49.2m² & 49.5 m² respectively. The houses are set in a well-established and well-serviced area with plenty of amenities nearby. The homes have a private rear patio and garden, and domestic pets such as dogs, cats and certain birds are allowed.

The new homes are currently under construction and are expected to become available in February 2026. Applications are invited from eligible households from 11.00 am on Wednesday 21st of January 2026.
