Dear Sir / Madam,

I wish to submit an observation to the development of these wind turbines based on the below:

I live in Kilmaclenine, Ballyclough. I am extremely disappointed with the prospect of the huge amount of very big turbines being put up in this beautiful landscape/community. Erecting 9x 175metre turbines would totally dominate the landscape.

The resulting noise would destroy the peace and tranquillity enjoyed by generations. As a resident who will be within one kilometre of these industrial turbines, I am genuinely concerned about noise pollution, vibrations, and shadow flicker. These issues are very real and have been experienced and well documented by people living in close proximity to other windfarm developments.

Development of such a windfarm proposed for our community, will accelerate depopulation in our rural area. Young couples and families even my own grandchildren in years to come that are interested in returning to the area will be put off the idea as it would mean building houses which would be impacted by the very visible presence of 175 metre high turbines, shadow flicker and noise pollution.

No regard has been given to the health/mental health and wellbeing of those living adjacent to these monsters. Grandchildren visiting is an important aspect of my life. With the presence of these enormous turbines within such close proximity to my home and the damaging health related risk factors associated with them, how could I continue to have my grandchildren visit and be exposed to those risks.

The disruption caused to the wildlife and biodiversity of the landscape by the construction/running and maintenance of the turbines is totally at odds with the conservation of the countryside.
