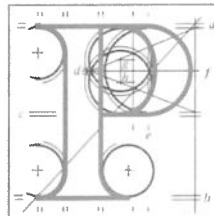

Reasons/Arguments:

1. I believe that the riverbank is not suitable for a greenway as the bank itself is quite eroded and more disturbance of that could put the riverbank at further risk of erosion and instability. This I believe could also negatively affect the water quality of the river beside it.
2. Increased lighting and traffic on the riverbank would lead to further disruption upon wildlife and may harm especially nocturnal animals that live along that stretch.
3. Removal of 61 trees is a significant loss, for which replanting cannot replenish satisfactorily for several years. Selection of trees and removal is also a concern and whether native trees will be planted in their place.
4. Current invasive species is a significant concern along that stretch of riverbank and will need to be dealt with (without harming the surrounding native plants) before works can go ahead. Other there will be move spreading of the invasive plants as the ground is redeveloped.
