Dear Sir/Madam,

We wish to make the following objections against the above SID application for the following reasons outlined below and can confirm that our property is located as per the attached map.

At the outset, we would like to confirm how utterly disappointed and frustrated we are with the communication we have had with the representatives of Statkraft and we feel nothing other than disrespected and insulted by these interactions. We were even told in response to our very genuine concerns and questions regarding this development that we were not doing our bit to help the environment and it was pointed out to us that we are driving two diesel cars. With such levels of disrespect and unprofessionalism we cannot have any faith in what has been put forward in this application nor could we have any faith in how it would be constructed and we therefore object to this proposal in the strongest terms.

1. Our property is located to the South of Turbines 1, 2 and 3 and to the North of Turbines 4, 5, 6 and 7 and is only approximately 1km from Turbines T3, T4 and T5. Furthermore, we are located between both site entrances and immediately to the East of one of the site entrances to the Southern section of the proposed Wind Farm. The substation is located to our Northwest and we are therefore severely impacted at both the construction and operational phases of this project. Being effectively surrounded by such massive turbines, in addition to the immediate proximity of the site entrances and the proximity of the sub-station really means that we and our property are uniquely and severely impacted.
2. Being so close to these turbines we believe that flicker of sunlight and the resultant shadow flicker will be a significant problem for us and our family. We understand that turbines can be turned off to avoid such affects but we can only rely on the

hope that this would be done in the event that this development proceeds and this hope is not something we can have full faith in happening, or indeed any faith, based on our interactions with Statkraft to date.

3. The visual affects of such large turbines is simply a matter of fact and the utter proliferation of such large turbines in the immediately surrounding area is something that does not appear to exist elsewhere. We recognise the importance of green energy but this area surely cannot be expected to carry far more than its fair share and to now be expected to carry even more of this share. The accusation of “not in my backyard” cannot be leveled at us as our backyard is now simply full.
4. At this proximity to the turbines we are also very concerned regarding noise affects and the cumulative noise affects of turbines in such close proximity to each other. In addition to this the prevailing winds will carry this noise towards us. We are aware that this has all been examined in detail in the Peer Review of Proposed Ballinla Wind Farm Planning Application prepared by Huson & Associates, W Les Huson BSc(Hons) MSc CPhys MInstP MIOA MAAS which is attached to the objection of Colm and Louise Quinn and we understand that this report goes to the heart of major technical considerations and reason as to why the application should be refused.
5. The red light at nighttime will be a big issue for us and again the cumulative effect of this together with existing red lights in the vicinity is something that we feel is very unfair for us to have to tolerate forever and extending into the lifetimes of our children.
6. Due to the proximity of the turbines and the number of them we are extremely concerned regarding the wake affect on us, the extensive wildlife and woodland which we have enjoyed all of our lives and elite level equine industry and agriculture in the area. This has also been dealt with in further detail in the Peer Review Report of Huson and Associates. We even have pheasants living at the bottom of our garden, such is the peace and tranquillity of the life we enjoy with nature at our home.
7. Is the future development for dwelling houses for our children and families now to be effectively sterilised due to the presence of the windfarm either by refusal of planning permission or the simple desire of people and our children not wanting to live here? WE are in the process of splitting our property for this very purpose and we are now extremely concerned that could all be in vain.
8. We feel that the local road network is entirely unsuitable for this project and we have already experienced at first hand the disruption caused on surrounding roads by other wind farm developments.

We are aware that there is cross community support against this development and we fully support the objection of our neighbour's including those with very significant health, equine and animal welfare concerns

We truly believe there is nothing to recommend this application to us or to the people of this area and we call on An Comisiún Pleanála to refuse permission for this application for all of the reasons outlined above.
