In accordance with Section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, we, Garrane Green Energy Limited, give notice of our intention to make an application to An Comhairle Pleanála for permission for a period of 10 Ballynagall, Craggan and Garrane, County Limerick. The development is covered by the provisions of the Renewable Energy Directive (31) (Directives 2023/2413). The planning application is subject to section 37A(4) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended. Where a notice issues in accordance with section 37A(4B), the provisions of article 216A of the Planning and Development Regulations 2001 to 2025 shall apply.

- The proposed development will consist of the following:
1. Erection of 10 sub wind turbines with a tip height of 170m. The wind turbine will have a rotor diameter of 150m and a hub height of 95m.
 2. Upgrade of existing Access Tracks and construction of new permanent Access Tracks, permanent turbine hardstand areas and turbine foundations.
 3. Construction of two new bridge crossings on-site, one over the River Maigue and one over the Charleville Stream.
 4. Upgrade of existing site drainage network and installation of new site drainage.
 5. Wind Farm Internal Cabling connecting the wind turbines to the electrical substation.
 6. Construction of a permanent on-site ATIS 110KV Substation, including two single-storey control buildings with overhead line between Charleville and Killoan, including two 110KV/11KV transformer substations, all associated underground cabling, private well for water supply, wastewater holding tank, and all ancillary structures and works.
 7. Construction of a permanent double circuit 110KV underground cable and two steel cable interface masts to connect to the existing overhead line.
 8. Erection of a permanent 60m Meteorological Mast for monitoring wind speeds.
 9. Construction of a Temporary Construction Compound for use during construction.
 10. Upgrade of the existing entrance on the N20 (Site Entrance 1) (to be used for abnormal loads and turbine component delivery) and upgrade of the existing entrance on the L557 (Site Entrance 2) (to be used for all turbine transport traffic except for abnormal loads and turbine component delivery).
 11. 6 No. temporary spoil storage areas and 1 No. permanent spoil storage area.
 12. Biodiversity enhancement and landscape improvements associated with the Project.
 13. Landscaping, fencing and all associated ancillary works.
- This application is seeking a ten-year permission and a 35 year operational period from the date of actual commissioning of the entire wind farm.

This application is accompanied by an Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIA) and a Natural Impact Statement (NIS) prepared in respect of the construction, operation and decommissioning of the proposed development to facilitate turbine delivery from the port of entry at the port of Foynes to the site entrance at Garrane via N68, N18, M20, N21 and N20 and from the port of entry at Galloway Port to the site entrance at Garrane via Lough Alata Road, College Road, R339, L5034, R336, NE, M8, M18, N18, M20, N21 and N20.
