## Notice of Application to An Coimisiún Pleanála for Approval

Notice is hereby given that Mayo County Council proposes to seek the approval of An Coimisiún Pleanála under Section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) for N59 Carrowrevagh Bridge Rehabilitation Works in the townlands of Carrowrevagh and Carrowkennedy, County Mayo.

The proposed development consists of the rehabilitation of the existing Carrowrevagh Bridge on the N59 National Secondary Road. The proposed works comprise;

- Reinstatement of original bed levels at the upstream elevation of the structure,
- Masonry repairs and repointing to the masonry arch section of the bridge,
- Localised concrete repairs to the reinforced concrete deck slab soffit,
- Installation of rock armour to the northeast embankment downstream of the structure,
- Increasing the height of the existing bridge parapets using masonry construction,
- Waterproofing the existing reinforced concrete deck slab,
- Installation of safety barriers on both verges over the structure and on approaches.

A Natura Impact Statement (NIS) has been prepared in respect of the proposed development.

An Coimisiún Pleanála may give approval to the application for development with or without conditions or may refuse the application for development.

Plans and particulars of the proposed development, including the Natura Impact Statement, will be available for inspection free of charge, or for purchase at a fee not exceeding the reasonable cost of making a copy, for a period of 6 weeks from *Monday 18<sup>th</sup> August 2025 to Monday 29<sup>th</sup> September 2025* (inclusive of both dates) at the following locations:

- i. the likely effects on the environment of the proposed development,
- ii. the likely consequences for proper planning and sustainable development in the area in which it is proposed to situate the proposed development, and
- iii. the likely significant effects of the proposed development on a European Site.

The deadline for submissions or observations to An Coimisiún Pleanála is **5.30pm on Monday 29**<sup>th</sup> **September 2025.** 

A person may question the validity of any such decision by An Coimisiún Pleanála by way of an application for judicial review under Order 84 of the Rules of the Superior Courts (S.I. No. 15 of 1986) as provided for in Section 50 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended).
