To whom it concerns,

My name is Anne McTigue, and I have lived in Ratesh, Kilconly for all of my sixty years. This place is my home. I love the peace and quiet of the countryside, the lovely walks through the bog, and the sense of calm that comes from living close to nature. It is a beautiful, tranquil area with very little traffic — a place where people still greet each other on the road and where generations have lived in harmony with the land.

I am deeply worried about the proposed Shancloon Wind Farm and what it will mean for our community, our environment, and our health. The noise, the flicker, and the constant presence of these huge turbines will destroy the peace that defines this area. I fear the illnesses and stress such a project will cause, not only to people but to animals too. This is not just an inconvenience — it is a real danger to our wellbeing.

The environmental impact will be immense. Digging up the bogs will destroy the natural habitats where local wildlife lives and thrives. Once those ecosystems are gone, they are gone forever. The removal of peat and the introduction of concrete and steel will damage our ground and water systems. Whatever leaks into the soil will pollute the groundwater that so many of us depend on.

In recent years, flooding has already become more common in fields that have never flooded before. If this project goes ahead and the bogs are disturbed, that flooding will only get worse. The bogs are natural sponges that protect our land — tearing them up is asking for trouble.

I also want to speak about the personal side of this. I suffer from **migraines**, and I walk through the bogs to find peace and fresh air when I feel unwell. My son is **asthmatic**, and I fear what all the dust and pollution from construction will do to his health. The thought of living with the constant noise, the flashing lights, and the loss of our quiet countryside fills me with anxiety. If this project is granted permission, it will have a severe impact on my **mental health** to see our beautiful area destroyed.

At 180 metres tall, these turbines are simply far too big for an area like ours. I fully support climate action, but this is not the way to do it. These projects should be placed offshore, where they can generate clean energy without destroying the natural environment where people and wildlife live.

The developer has shown no real consideration for the people who live here — no real engagement, no compassion for how this will change our lives.

I am asking you to please think of the people who call this place home — to think of our mental and physical health, our peace of mind, and our right to live in a safe, natural, and healthy environment.

Please refuse permission for the Shancloon Wind Farm. Protect our community and our landscape for the generations to come.
