Dear Sir or Madam,

My name is Peggy O'Malley, and I live in Ardour, Kilconly. I have lived here for over 40 years and love this area for its tranquillity, natural beauty, and vibrant community spirit. It is a peaceful place, surrounded by good neighbours, open skies, and the sounds of nature. The landscape here is still largely untouched — a place where people and wildlife live side by side in harmony.

I spend a lot of time out in the fresh air, enjoying walks around the bog and fields, where there is always something to see — a hare crossing the road, a fox slipping through the grass, or the Whooper Swans returning each winter to rest on the flooded fields. The quiet and connection to nature are what make living here so special.

I am deeply worried about the proposed Shancloon Windfarm and what it will mean for this area. The bog is an irreplaceable habitat, home to countless species of birds, insects, and animals. Disturbing or removing peat will have devastating consequences for the local ecosystem, leading to loss of biodiversity, increased flooding, and possible water contamination.

The noise from construction and operation will shatter the peace and quiet we all value so much. Living this close, I could also be affected by shadow flicker, which would make it hard to relax or even sit comfortably in my own home. I worry that deer and other wildlife will be driven from their habitats and forced onto nearby roads, increasing the danger for both animals and people.

The visual impact of such large turbines on this beautiful rural landscape will be terrible. These are not small structures and they will dominate everything around them and completely change the character of the place. Our properties will lose value, and it will likely be impossible for young people to get planning permission in the area in the future.

What is hardest to accept is that the local people have not been properly consulted. There has been no public meeting, and neighbours were never informed directly. It feels like decisions are being made about our home without any respect for the people who actually live here. Everyone I talk to is distressed and worried. It has caused real anxiety in what was once a peaceful and happy community.

This project threatens to destroy the very things that make this place worth living in - the wildlife, the landscape, the peace, and the strong sense of community. I am asking that you please refuse this application and protect what remains of our beautiful rural environment.

Once it's gone, it can never be replaced.
