I live 320m and 380m from two turbines, of the Mauricetown Wind Farm, Co Limerick. We are affected by continuous turbine noise and shadow flicker. The experience has been very difficult for me and my family, be it night or day - the noise is too loud and the shadow flicker gives us all a headache, and great annoyance there is no safe place in my home with the shadow flicker.

I have been raising complaints to Limerick City and County Council since the turbines started and while the staff have been polite and sympathetic, there has been no improvement to our situation. There was a noise monitoring investigation but I haven't been given a copy of the noise report.

The constant noise, loud banging, sounds like a helicopter landing in my backyard and the flicker have made it impossible to enjoy our home and garden in peace. There are a lot of times you can not even stand in my backyard. The noise is so bad.

I object because I don't want Limerick communities to suffer like us. The planning authorities shouldn't be allowed to grant planning when there is no proper system in place for when things go wrong.

I have read that Limerick Councillors voted for all wind farm complaints to be referred to the HSE. This might be helpful, while Council staff have been courteous, we are experiencing shadow flicker, noise and headaches for years. I am waiting confirmation that my complaint has been forwarded to the HSE

I ask the Council to consider the ongoing impact on those of us already affected, and to refuse this application until there are proper procedures in place to address existing complaints. Adding more wind farms will only make this situation worse. Planning laws are there to protect the environment and protect neighbours.
