

Located in Ballincurra, Ballingayroure, Ballinlee North & South, Ballinrea, Ballyreesode, Camas North & South, Carrigeen, Knockuregare, Ballybane and other townlands in County Limerick.**

To Whom It May Concern,

I Claire Daly write in connection with the above listed planning application at Ballincurra, Ballingayroure, Ballinlee North & South, Ballinrea, Ballyreesode, Camas North & South, Carrigeen, Knockuregare, Ballybane and other townlands in County Limerick.

We wish to object strongly to this proposal and ask that the Board refuse planning permission.

Some of my summarised observations and concerns are as follows:

## 1. Property Value and Noise Impact

The proposed development may negatively affect the value of nearby properties due to increased noise and disturbance.

The area is currently peaceful and rural, and additional noise from construction, machinery, or increased activity would significantly alter its character and tranquility.

## 2. Grid Connection and Infrastructure Concerns

Concerns about how the grid connection will be established and whether it will require further infrastructure such as pylons, trenches, or substations.

Potential disruption to land and local access during installation and maintenance.

## 3. Landscape and Wildlife Impact

The proposed site contributes to the local landscape's natural beauty and biodiversity.

I regularly see pheasants in the area, and storks are often visible along the river — both could be disturbed or displaced by the development.

The loss or alteration of natural habitat would negatively affect these and other local species.

## 4. Traffic and Road Safety

Increased traffic during both the construction and operational phases raises serious

I strongly urge that this development be rejected for the reasons outlined above.

I/we request that for an Oral Hearing in relation to this wind farm application, for the reasons outlined above. In particular the proximity and impact this will have on Lough Gur, an architectural and archaeological site of international importance, and the impact on our Golden Vale's High Value Landscape. Furthermore the scale of the project and the pattern of population distribution which will have widespread impact on our local community.
