To whom it may concern,

We are writing to formally object to the proposed installation of 17 wind turbines located in Ballincurra, Ballingayrou, Ballinlee North & South, Ballinrea, Ballyreesode, Camas North & South, Carrigeen, Knockuregare, Ballybane and other townlands in County Limerick. While we acknowledge and support national efforts to increase renewable energy, we have significant reservations about the suitability of this proposal and the potential negative consequences for the local community.


1. The turbines would dominate and disrupt the natural look of the area. Instead of blending into the rural setting, their size would overpower the open fields and farmland that make this landscape so distinctive.
2. We are concerned about the close proximity of the proposed turbines to residential homes. Their location raises significant issues regarding safety, shadow flicker, and the overall quality of life for those living near the development.
3. Additionally, we are concerned about the impact of construction-related traffic on the area. The roads leading into Bruff—particularly around the bridge—already pose difficulties for large vehicles such as buses and lorries. It is hard to see how

construction equipment and turbine components of this scale could be transported safely without causing significant disruption or damage to local infrastructure.

4. Furthermore, we also wish to highlight concerns within the community regarding potential health impacts. For residents already managing conditions such as asthma or sleep apnoea, any increase in noise, dust, or disruption during construction—or ongoing low-frequency turbine noise— may be more vulnerable to disturbances associated with this development, therefore impacting on their health.
5. There are real questions about the overall environmental footprint of wind turbines, including the impact of construction, the resources needed for ongoing maintenance, and the challenges involved in safely disposing of them at the end of their lifespan.

We respectfully request that An Bord Pleanála considered our concerns before reaching their final decision.
