My greatest concern is future planning applications in this area as my family and I are planning to upgrade our cottage in the near future. I strongly disagree that this is the right area for wind turbines. There are a lot of families like mine that should be allowed to have a peaceful and uninterrupted life here in Dromin where we have all settled

While I support efforts to transition to renewable energy sources I believe that such projects should be chosen correctly and appropriately scaled. In this case I do not believe that the proposed site is suitable for a development of this scale.

I am also very concerned about the effect that the activity at the borrow pit will have on my horses. During all of the construction period there will be noise, dust and machine movement which is a dangerous and upsetting attack on their keen senses and peripheral vision.
