Re: 10 year planning permission for Ballinlee Wind Farm consisting of 17 no. wind turbines, a permanent 110kV substation and ancillary development. Located in Ballincurra, Ballingayrou, Ballinlee North & South, Ballinrea, Ballyreesode, Camas North & South, Carrigeen, Knockuregare, Ballybane and other townlands in County Limerick.

To whom it may concern,

I wish to object to the proposed Ballinlee wind turbine development in the Bruff, Dromin and Athlacca town lands.

The scale and height of the turbines will greatly alter the character of the surrounding landscape. Nearby residents are likely to experience visual dominance, noise disturbance, and shadow flicker, all of which can negatively affect quality of life.

Large turbine developments can disrupt local wildlife. The construction and operation phases will disturb habitats, pose risks to bird and bat populations, and alter drainage or soil conditions.

The transportation of turbine components will require heavy vehicles on rural roads not designed for such loads. This raises concerns about road safety, road damage, and general disruption to the community during the construction period.

The proposed turbines would be highly visible from a wide area and would significantly alter the rural character of the local area and other communities. Once constructed, this change is effectively irreversible.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that the planning authority refuse permission for this development.
