West Waterford welcomes new Commissioner for Oaths

WEST Waterford welcomed a new Commissioner for Oaths this week with the appointment of Monica Murphy. The decision marks a significant step in making essential legal services more accessible to residents and businesses across the regions of Tallow, Knockanore, Kiltarnorney and Glendine, as well as towns and villages in the wider West Waterford region.

A Commissioner for Oaths is authorised to witness and certify the signing of documents such as affidavits, statutory declarations, and other sworn statements. In practical terms, this role helps ensure the integrity and authenticity of important paperwork used in courts, property transactions, and various civic processes.

The appointment comes at a time when there are calls for greater convenience and faster processing of legal paperwork for people living in rural areas. Monica Murphy will operate from a dedicated office at her home in Knockanore as well as from her business premises in Cappoquin.

"I was approached by an experienced legal professional who suggested that I pursue this appointment, given that there was no such service in Tallow or the surrounding areas. I know the challenge of it myself from a business perspective, having to get rendered documents signed by a Commissioner for Oaths at the 11th hour before paperwork must be submitted".

The new commissioner added that she is committed to providing clear, courteous service and helping people to navigate the sometimes complex requirements of sworn declarations. COMPULSORY ACQUISITION OF LAND Waterford City & County Council, Footpath Construction at Monea, Ardmore, Co. Waterford. Compulsory Purchase Order 2025, (No. 3)

The Waterford City & County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the local authority"), acting on its own behalf, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 76 of the Housing Act, 1966, and the Third Schedule thereto, as extended by section 10 of the Local Government (No. 2) Act, 1966 as substituted by section 86 of the Housing Act, 1966 as amended by section 6 and the Second Schedule to the Roads Act, 1993 and as amended by the Planning and Development Act, 2000, as amended, have made an order titled as above which will be submitted to An Coimisiún Pleanála for confirmation. If confirmed, the order will authorise the local authority to acquire compulsorily the land in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of connectivity from the existing footpath in Ardmore Village to Ardmore GAA field at Monea, Ardmore, Co. Waterford. Owners, lessees and occupiers of the land described in the Schedule will receive individual written notice.

Any objections to the Compulsory Purchase Order should be made in writing to An Coimisiún Pleanála, 64 Marlborough Street, Dublin 1, to be received no later than 5:30pm on Friday 21st November, 2025.

Land other than land consisting of a house or houses unfit for human habitation and not capable of being rendered fit for human habitation at reasonable expense. The land included in the Schedule is situated in the functional area of Waterford City & County Council.
