Welcome

Welcome to the website for the Kingston Park and Millers Lane Public Urban Realm Project.

Working alongside Galway City Council, a design team, consisting primarily of DLRA, Quinn Architects and MKO, have recently begun work on this project which will be transformational for the Knocknacarra area and Rahoon Area.

The purpose of this website is to provide an introduction to the project and a space where the community can be informed about the aims and the vision of the project.

We invite you to read these Information Boards and provide feedback through our Community Survey Questionnaire. Please note the project is still at an early stage and we will be undertaking more detailed public consultation in early 2025 as the project progresses.

Project Funding

Galway City Council are providing initial funding for the project and shall seek funding from other sources.
Funding has been sought from the Large Scale Sports Infrastructure Fund (LSSIF) which was announced by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media in April 2024. The aim of the fund is to provide Exchequer support for larger sports facility projects. The scheme has a particular focus on National Governing Bodies of Sport (NGBs) and local authorities.

Galway City Council are currently in the process of identifying additional funding streams for the project.













Vision & Objectives

The vision and objectives for this project are:

- To create a suitable balance of passive and active recreation opportunities.
- To provide a range of diverse new social spaces to cater for all age groups and all members of the locality.
- To provide for a range of sports facilities for both public and club use.
- To develop strong pedestrian and cycle circulation networks with easily accessible connections that link both Neighbourhood Parks with their surrounding environment.
- To create a network of green spaces and to enhance biodiversity and climate resilient green infrastructure in the area.



















Context

- Urban green spaces (also known as Green Infrastructure) are an important resource for communities providing for passive and active recreation. Green spaces also shape the identity of neighbourhoods and provide a sense of place. They can enhance people's quality of life and support mental health and physical wellbeing and provide quiet space, space for social interaction and play space. They contribute to climate resilience through their effects on negating urban heat, offsetting greenhouse gas emissions and attenuating surface water.
- Both Kingston Park and Millers Lane are zoned for 'Recreation and Amenity' in the Galway City Development Plan (2023-2029).
- Kingston Park is primarily surrounded by residential developments and is in close proximity to Knocknacarra National School.
- Similarly, Millers Lane is surrounded by residential developments to the North, East and South. It is also adjacent to An Gaelscoil Mhic Amhlaigh (Primary Gael school), and to lands zoned for 'Enterprise, Light Industry and Commercial' and 'Enterprise, Industry and Related Uses.'
- This project would therefore benefit a wealth of people in the local community, including local residents, school children, and workers in the area.















The Opportunity to Connect

West Galway city is expanding, with more housing planned for the neighbourhoods of Knocknacarra and Rahoon. Right now, there is a shortfall of active and passive recreational facilities that are needed for these neighbourhoods. The Kingston and Millers Lane parks will assist to balance needs and will help to close this gap.

The design of Kingston Park and Millers Lane is an opportunity to make connections across the neighbourhoods of Knocknacarra and Rahoon. The parks could be designed to connect People & Wildlife in west Galway City.


- Parks act as larger patches of green space that connect wildlife along corridors of green to other green patches. Patches and corridors that connect form a network of habitats that better supports biodiversity.

What's in Kingston Park

Site Overview

Kingston Park is the larger of the two sites, covering approximately 4.8 hectares. The lands comprise an element of made up ground and agricultural fields. To the northwest, the park is bordered by Saint John the Apostle National School, while the surrounding areas consist of housing estates or land designated for future residential development.

Presently, the park is accessed from the Western Distributor Road via the school's access road (L10111), which is not a through route for vehicular traffic. However, pedestrian and cycle routes extend along the school's northern boundary, providing a connection to Clybaun Road to the west, ensuring convenient access for walkers and cyclists.

The project is committed to provide a new rugby pitch and associated facilities at Kingston Park. New routes through Kingston Park will connect existing and future active travel routes through the neighbourhood. Following a comprehensive ecological survey of the site, existing and new habitats will help to connect wildlife and people in the area.

The site can accommodate more activities, and we want to hear from you about what you would like to do in Kingston Park.

































What's in Millers Lane

Site Overview

Millers Lane is approximately 2 hectares in size. The site is bounded by the L5000 road to the west and by Millers Lane to the east. North and south of the site are Gort na Greine and Gort na Bro residential estates. On the opposite side of the L5000 road is Gaelscoil Mhic Amhlaigh, a national school. Presently, the park is accessed from the L5000 road to the west of the site and from Millers Lane.

The project is committed to provide a new hockey pitch, an upgraded soccer pitch and associated facilities at Millers Lane park. New routes through the park will connect existing and future active travel routes through the neighbourhood. Following a comprehensive ecological survey of the site, existing and new habitats will help to connect wildlife and people in the area.

The site can accommodate more activities, and we want to hear from you about what you would like to do in Millers Lane Park.
