



Re: Proposed Expansion of the Knockharley Landfill. Case no: 323977

To Whom it May Concern.,

As a member of the Local Community I wish to raise my concerns in regards to the proposed expansion to the landfill. When the landfill was opened we were informed it would be finished up by now but with this proposal it will be at least 2043 before it ends.

When it opened first the community was receiving more funds compared to the present day, with increased tonnage going in there are many factors that affect the community including Increase to traffic, wear and tear on the roads, carbon emissions are increased, and the impact to Health for the local community and school. We appreciate that recycling is a good thing for the environment but this comes at a cost to the locals and the factors outlined above seem to outweigh what good is being done.

The increase to 440000 tonnes means that there would be 14666 trips approx into the landfill, not including the outgoing traffic leaving with recycling. Going forward the local community should receive at least €3 per tonne for every load that goes across the weighbridge as the Company gets paid for all waste going in and any that leaves the facility.

Please don't keep dumping on the Local Community!
