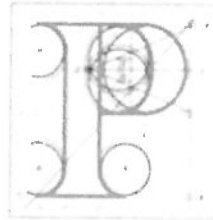

Uisce Éireann Compulsory Purchase (Water Supply Project Eastern and Midlands region) Order 2025 in Counties Tipperary, Offaly, Kildare and Dublin.

Dear Colleague,

We refer to the above and your correspondence dated 24th and 26th June last. We confirm, on behalf of our client, that we strongly reiterate the objections as outlined in our original letter of objection to you dated 16th January and 16th February. We confirm that Uisce Éireann's response does not adequately address the issues raised.

We do not accept Uisce Éireann's contention that the issues raised relate exclusively to matters which can be dealt with by the Property Arbitrator. We do not believe that the issues raised can be dealt with under C.P.O. legislation and rules and are definitely matters appropriate for ACP and an Inspector to deal with. In addition we are very surprised that Uisce Éireann are referring to "property arbitrator" at this very early stage of the planning and C.P.O. process. Our client has always and remains of the view that these matters can be agreed and resolved through consultation and dialogue between herself, her agents and representatives of Uisce Éireann as a development authority rather than through the adversarial process of formal and legal property arbitration which our client does not wish to become involved in unless as an absolute last resort when all other avenues open to stakeholders have failed to achieve reasonable resolution.
