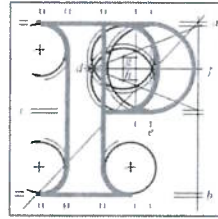

The Burrow Portrane Coastal flooding and Erosion Management
(CFERM) Scheme.

Dear Sir or Madam,

With regard for the above referenced application, I wish to record my full support for the:

- Construction of seven fishtail (Y shaped) groynes structures with beach nourishment scheme
- Construction of a.c. 19m long earth embankment;
- Construction of a combined c. 130m long sheet piled flood wall and a.c. 200m embankment.
- Installation of back drainage behind the proposed defences with associated outfalls;
- Installation of non return valves to existing outfalls to prevent back flow of water from the Estuary;

These works are now critical and essential for the protection of our community.

I am second generation in the Burrow with 3rd and fourth coming after me. I have

been aware of the erosion for the best part of 40 years now. It has got so much worse in that time, with storms getting stronger each year, most of the dunes are no longer there, there is more of an expanse of water to be whipped up by the storms.

It is now a very urgent situation all along the beach in the Burrow Portraire and not just where the Groynes are to be positioned.

I hope that when they have the Groynes positioned that they will work, and come further down the beach.

The community is under great stress at the the present time, some can't sleep at night afraid of where they will be the next morning.

It is a very popular area for visitors to come to walk along the seashore looking out at Lambay Island, having a fish supper from Pipers Award winning chippies, or calling into the Brook pub for a coffee or a pint and enjoying the comic with locals who still manage to smile against all the odds how they do is a mystery.

Therefore I beg you to look favourably on this proposal and grant it's construction for the long term survival and the sanity of our community.
