Hi Eirene,

Thank you for your email.

I have been in contact with a planning inspector regarding your query please see their response below:

'In reference to the Planning and Development Regulations, the following should be considered:

- **Article 22** of the Regulations stipulates that location maps of sufficient size and containing details of features in the vicinity such as to permit the identification of the site to which the application relates, to a scale not be less than 1:2500, unless agreed otherwise and that the site or layout plans shall be drawn to a scale of not less than 1:500 or such other scale as may be agreed with the planning authority prior to the submission of the application.

Given that the proposed scales deviate from the standard requirements but would reduce the need for excessive drawings while still providing sufficient detail, I am of the view that they may be acceptable, provided there are no other concerns.

I recommend, therefore, that the proposed scales are acceptable, provided the drawings clearly show features on, adjoining or in the vicinity of the land or structure to which the application relates, as required by the Regulations.'

period which may be allowed by the High Court in accordance with subsection 50(8), any application for judicial review must be made within 8 weeks of the decision of the Commission. It should be noted that any challenge taken under section 50 may question only the validity of the decision and the Courts do not adjudicate on the merits of the development from the perspectives of the proper planning and sustainable development of the area and/or effects on the environment. Section 50A states that leave for judicial review shall not be granted unless the Court is satisfied that there are substantial grounds for contending that the decision is invalid or ought to be quashed and that the applicant has a sufficient interest in the matter which is the subject of the application or in cases involving environmental impact assessment is a body complying with specified criteria.

Section 50B contains provisions in relation to the cost of judicial review proceedings in the High Court relating to specified types of development (including proceedings relating to decisions or actions pursuant to a law of the state that gives effect to the public participation and access to justice provisions of Council Directive 85/337/EEC i.e. the EIA Directive and to the provisions of Directive 2001/12/EC i.e. Directive on the assessment of the effects on the environment of certain plans and programmes). The general provision contained in section 50B is that in such cases each party shall bear its own costs. The Court however may award costs against any party in specified circumstances. There is also provision for the Court to award the costs of proceedings or a portion of such costs to an applicant against a respondent or notice party where relief is obtained to the extent that the action or omission of the respondent or notice party contributed to the relief being obtained.

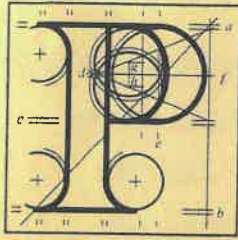

On behalf of our client RWE Renewables Ireland Ltd (the prospective applicant), TOBIN hereby requests to enter into consultation with An Bord Pleanála for Design Flexibility under Section 37CC (1) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, for the proposed Ballincor Wind Farm, which is located in Co. Offaly and Co. Tipperary.

Background Context

This request for consultation for Design Flexibility is required to form part of consultations under Section 37B of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended (PDA). The prospective applicant previously entered into pre-application consultation with An Bord Pleanála on the 22nd February 2024 under Section 37B of the PDA in relation to the proposed wind farm development (ABP 318666-24 and attached). This consultation is currently open with the Board and no decision has been made as to whether the proposed development constitutes Strategic Infrastructure Development (SID). However, the preliminary opinion given by the Board's representatives was that the proposed development falls within the scope of strategic infrastructure.

As part of consultations under Section 37B, we are seeking a design flexibility meeting with An Bord Pleanála under Section 37CC(1) of the PDA. Section 37(CC) (1) provides as follows:

"37CC. (1) A person who proposes to apply for permission for any development specified in the Seventh Schedule (referred to in this section and section 37CD as a 'prospective applicant') may request a meeting with the Board for the purposes of section 37CD as part of consultations referred to in section 37B(1)."

The following sections of this letter set out the information identified in section 37CC of the PDA.

Prospective Applicant Details:

RWE aim to make a significant contribution to Ireland's commitment to produce 80% of electricity from renewable sources by the end of the decade.

Site Location Details

For the purpose of this consultation, the proposed development will be located in the townlands of:

- Curalanty, Ballincor Demesne, Cloonaheen, Co. Offaly; and
- Clonfree, Cronekill and Castletown, Co. Tipperary.

In a wider context, the site of the proposed Ballincor Wind Farm is located 5 km south of Birr on the north County Tipperary and west Offaly border. The site ranges in elevation from 55 to 65m AOD, bordering the Little Brosna river to the east. Access to the site from the regional (R492) and local road network is good. Within the proposed wind farm site, there are existing farm roads which provide good access around the site. These roads are well maintained and in good condition. There are also several local roads both within and adjacent to the site. The site location map is enclosed with this letter.

Description of Nature and Scale of Development

The Ballincor Wind Farm will consist of the following project components (these details are provisional and subject to review as part of the design and EIA processes):

- 11 wind turbines (including tower sections, nacelle, hub, rotor blades) with an estimated capacity of 61.6-77.0 MW, with a blade tip height between 179.5 and 180 m, rotor diameter of between 149 to 163 m, hub height of between 98.5 m and 105m.
- The development will also include:
 - Associated hardstanding at each turbine location;
 - Turbine foundations;
 - New access roads and upgrading of existing access and local roads;
 - Construction of site entrances;
 - Erection of permanent meteorological mast



- Surface water drainage system and sediment control;
- Installation of new watercourse or drain crossings;
- Borrow pits;
- Works along the public road for a grid connection to the existing Clondallow 110 kV substation;
- Electrical and communication cables, linking the turbines to the proposed grid connection point;
- 110kV electricity substation and switch rooms;
- 1 no. EirGrid control building containing worker welfare facilities and equipment store;
- 1 no. Independent Power Producer (IPP) control building containing HV switch room, site offices, kitchen facilities, storeroom and toilet amenities.
- Wastewater holding tank;
- All electrical plant and infrastructure and grid ancillary services equipment;
- Battery energy storage system (BESS) and associated works;
- All associated infrastructure and services including site works and signage;
- Works along the public road for a turbine delivery route.
- All related site works and ancillary development including berms, landscaping, and soil excavation;
- Tree felling to facilitate construction and operation of the proposed development;
- Measures designed to protect and enhance existing habitats.
- Parking;
- Lighting;
- Security Fencing and;
- Works along the public road for Grid Connection Route (GCR) and Turbine Delivery Route (TDR);
- Temporary construction compounds; and
- Rainwater harvesting equipment.

Details Unlikely to be Confirmed at Application Lodgement

The details of the proposed development unlikely to be confirmed at the time of the proposed application are as follows:

- Turbine Total Tip Height
- Turbine Rotor Diameter
- Turbined Hub Height

The parameters within which the turbine specifications will fall are as follows:

- Total tip height range of 179.5m – 180m
- Rotor diameter range of 149m – 163m
- Hub height range of 98.5 m to 105m

Each turbine will be capable of generating from 5.6 MW to 7.0 MW, with an overall installed capacity of between 61.5 MW to 77.0 MW inclusive.

The proposed application will contain the necessary information and details of the parameters set out above on which the application can be made and decided.

The design flexibility requirement arises as the exact make and model of the turbine cannot be confirmed prior to making the application as this will be dictated by a competitive tender process of the various turbines on the market at the time of procurement and construction. Furthermore, a certain degree of futureproofing and flexibility for turbines is required to ensure the most up to date technology can be deployed. This is necessary as the preparation of any wind energy application can require in excess of 2



years of environmental and ecological monitoring and surveying whilst the planning consent process itself can take in excess of 2 years. In addition, due to the complexity and nature of wind farm developments including the need for other processes to be completed such as the Grid Application Process with EirGrid, 10 year permissions are generally sought.

As the consenting processes are subject to their own independent time frames and wind energy technology is also simultaneously changing and improving this means that turbines available at the time of the planning application may become obsolete or have ceased production by the time the permitted wind farm development is ready to procure them on the market and to move into the construction phase.

Thus, given the nature of wind farm developments, built in turbine flexibility is a key aspect of transitioning a grant of permission into an operational renewable energy generator.

This necessitates the requirement for associated unconfirmed details to be included in the application.

A brief description of the nature and purpose of the proposed development and of its possible effects on the environment is set out in Form 20 attached.

Legal Interest in Land

RWE Renewables Ireland Ltd have option and lease agreements in place for all lands on which the proposed Ballincor Wind Farm will be situated.

Planning Authority

The proposed Ballincor Wind Farm is located within the functional boundaries of Offaly and Tipperary County Councils.

The grid connection associated with the wind farm will also be included in the planning application. It is proposed that this connection will be an underground 110 kV electrical cable from an on-site substation to the existing Clondallow 110kV substation in County Offaly. The grid connection will therefore be located within the functional boundaries of two planning authorities, Tipperary County Council and Offaly County Council.

Conclusion

As part of consultation under Section 37B of the PDA, we request a meeting with An Bord Pleanála under Section 37CC(1) in order to obtain an opinion on whether it is appropriate to submit an application for permission before certain details of the proposed development are confirmed.

Given the pressing requirement for renewable energy development to meet national targets and the limited nature of the unconfirmed details proposed, we respectfully request the Board to expedite this request as soon as possible.

The applicant and the project Team, led by TOBIN, are available to meet with the Board at your earliest possible convenience, in order to present the details that will be unconfirmed at the time of submission of the application.

A payment of €4,500 was previously made to the Board to cover the pre-application consultation under Section 37B of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended. It is our understanding that this payment would also cover the design flexibility pre-application consultation meeting. Should there be any query in the payment, please do not hesitate to contact the undersigned.

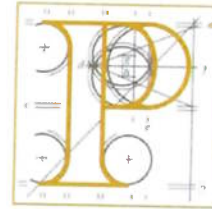

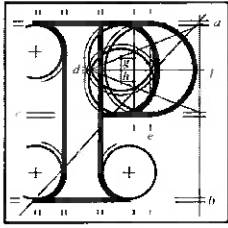

Introduction

The Board referred to the letter received from the prospective applicant on the 11th November 2023, requesting pre-application consultations under section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, and advised the prospective applicant that the instant meeting essentially constituted an information-gathering exercise for the Board; it also invited the prospective applicant to outline the nature of the proposed development and to highlight any matters that it wished to receive advice on from the Board. The Board's representatives mentioned the following general procedures in relation to the pre-application consultation process:

- The Board will keep a record of this meeting and any other meetings, if held. Such records will form part of the file which will be made available publicly at the conclusion of the process. The record of the meeting will not be amended by the Board once finalised, but the prospective applicant may submit comments on the record which will form part of the case file.
- The Board will serve notice at the conclusion of the process as to the strategic infrastructure status of the proposed development. It may form a preliminary view at an early stage in the process on the matter.
- A further meeting or meetings may be held in respect of the proposed development.
- Further information may be requested by the Board and public consultations may also be directed by the Board.
- The Board may hold consultations in respect of the proposed development with other bodies.
- The holding of consultations does not prejudice the Board in any way and cannot be relied upon in the formal planning process or in any legal proceedings.

Presentation made by the prospective applicant:

Information in relation to the applicant RWE was presented. They have been in Ireland since 2016 and have over 2,000MW of onshore and offshore projects under development. They currently have one onshore windfarm in operation and more than ten under development, two offshore windfarms in development, two battery storage facilities in operation and one in development and one operational airborne wind test site.

The prospective applicant provided a description of the proposed development. The proposed Ballincar windfarm will consist of 11 wind turbines, grid connection, turbine delivery route and a 110kV substation with battery energy storage. Each wind turbine has the potential to generate between 5.0 and 7.0 MW of power which results in maximum total power output of 77MW. Each turbine has a proposed tip height between 179m and 180m, a rotor diameter of between 149m and 155m and a hub height of between 102.5m and 105m. The prospective applicant discussed the key elements of the development but mentioned that they are provisional and subject to review as part of the design and environmental impact assessment process. The duration of the proposed developments operational life is intended to be 35 years.

The prospective applicant presented a site location map of the proposed development site. It depicted the red line boundary of the site in the context of proximity to local urban areas. The larger settlements in the vicinity are Birr to the north, Shinrone to the south and Carrig, the closest settlement to the northwest of the site.

The prospective applicant discussed the key features of the proposed site location. This proposed development is intended to be located on lands under the ownership of local landowners, who have consented to the making of the planning application.

The proposed development site covers an area approximately 530 hectares in size; this land is mainly agricultural land, forestry land, and peat land. The proposed development site is located west of the Little Brosna River with a topography of between 45m and 65m OD. The surrounding landscape of the proposed development site is mainly low lying except for Knockshigowna Hill located to the southwest. The Sharvogue Bog Special Area of Conservation located adjacent to Little Brosna River to the East of the site.

The prospective applicant presented images of the proposed development site. The prospective applicant presented map indicating all the constraints which inform the current layout of the turbines, including the location of nearby Special Areas of Conservation (SACs). The prospective applicant presented the initial turbine layout which was refined due to the proximity of constraints. The layout may still be subject to change and will be reviewed as constraint studies are being refined.

The prospective applicant briefly discussed site surveys which have been carried out. These include ecological and habitat surveys, and bird and bat surveys. Furthermore, peat probing to ascertain peat depth on site has been carried out and baseline noise and surface water monitoring are currently being carried out.

The prospective applicant has selected 30 viewpoints for the visual impact of the proposed development over a 20km radius.

The prospective applicant discussed the proposed grid connection route and is currently reviewing substation options for this proposed development. The preferred option emerging is the Dallow 110kV substation. Eight different grid connection route layouts being considered to connect the proposed development to Dallow 110kV substation. The prospective applicant has requested pre planning meetings with both Offaly and Tipperary County Council to discuss this proposed grid route connection. Site surveys, land consents and stakeholder engagement are currently

underway. The prospective applicant carried out a pre customer consultation meeting with the transmission system operator (EirGrid) in August 2023.

The prospective applicant discussed the proposed turbine delivery route. Preliminary assessment, visual assessment, and auto track analysis of all constraints along the route have been undertaken. The proposed turbine delivery route is from Foynes port in County Limerick following up the N56, the M7 and N62 using local roads to access the proposed development site.

The prospective applicant outlined EU, National and local policy in context with this proposed development. As this proposed development falls within the administrative areas of Offaly and Tipperary, local policy in both county development plans is being taken into consideration.

The prospective applicant outlined EU, National and Regional policies, all of which favour renewable energy projects. This proposed development will contribute to reaching renewable energy targets as set out in the National Climate Action Plan.

The prospective applicant presented the EIA scoping undertaken to date and provided a list of prescribed bodies in which they have or will be engaging with in relation to the proposed development.

The prospective applicant detailed the public consultations undertaken to date. The project website is live and provides the latest information and updates in relation to this proposed development. There is a dedicated Community Liaison Officer for the local community to answer any questions or concerns that may arise. Community engagement to date was detailed and the first round of community engagement was carried out in July 2023, the second round of community engagement is intended to take place in Q1 of 2024.

The prospective applicant discussed the next steps which will be taken in relation to this proposed development. An EIAR and an NIS will be carried out for this project, continued environmental surveys and monitoring will be carried out in and around the proposed development site and community consultations will continue.

The prospective applicant is intending to submit a planning application in Q3 of 2024. The prospective applicant gave their opinion that they believe this proposed development falls within the scope of Section 37A of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended.

Discussion:

- The Boards representatives discussed the location of the proposed site and asked the prospective applicant if they have assessed wind speeds and has this been taken into consideration in the proposed turbine layout. The prospective applicant stated that they have had wind monitoring devices on site for over 2 years and have been monitoring data collected.
- The Boards representatives pointed out the presence of an airfield located northeast of the proposed development site. They questioned if this airfield is still in operation. The prospective applicant stated that they will take the airfield into account in their assessment.
- The Boards representatives noted the presence of peat on the subject site and stressed the importance that a robust assessment of peat stability be carried out as this could be a significant issue. This issue should be comprehensively addressed in the environmental impact assessment report. The prospective applicant stated that although peat partly overlies the proposed site, there is only one single turbine that will be located on peat. All other turbines will be located on lands currently occupied by forestry, notwithstanding this, the applicant will carry on a robust peat stability risk assessment for this turbine.

- The Boards representatives noted that the proposed development site is in close proximity to a Special Area of Conservation, Sharvogue Bog, and recommended that the EIAR robustly assess any drainage implications the proposed development might have for the Bog. The prospective applicant stated that the natural hydrological boundary runs between the bog and the proposed site. Water level monitoring has been carried out on the proposed site. The Boards representatives stated that there are several streams located on site and recommended that the prospective applicant take these into account in its studies particularly in relation to any European Sites located downstream that maybe hydrologically connected to the subject site.
- The Boards representatives noted the presence of other windfarms in the area, and studies undertaken by the applicant should assess all cumulative impacts. The Boards representatives also noted that there is another proposed windfarm development which is currently within the planning application stage with the Board (ABP-318689-23), this windfarm should also be included in any in-combination/cumulative impacts should it be granted.
- The Boards representatives recommended that the prospective applicant take into consideration post construction decommissioning in studies and reports accompanying the application.
- The Boards representatives recommended that the prospective applicant has secured all landowner consent from all landowners involved in the project.
- The Boards representatives noted that the site in question appears to be located in an area not deemed appropriate in either the Offaly or Tipperary development plans. This could represent and significant issue having regard to recent legal case law in respect of the primacy of the development plan in assessing applications.
- The Boards representatives recommended that the prospective applicant liaises with the National Parks and Wildlife Services and seek opinion and

recommendations in relation to the quality and content of surveys and reports they have completed to date.

- The Boards representatives recommended that due to the proximity of local residential areas, that the EIAR incorporate robust noise assessment reports. The prospective applicant stated that all local residential areas are located at least 720m from the nearest turbine. However, landowners in agreement with the proposed development are located slightly closer to the proposed site, but still more than 500m distance from the nearest turbine.
- The prospective applicant questioned if the whole proposed development can be submitted to the Board under section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) (i.e. windfarm, substation and grid connection). The Board's representatives indicated that the Board have in the past accepted the totality of the project in a single application under the provisions of S37E.
- The Boards representatives questioned if there are any constraints in relation to the turbine delivery route. The prospective applicant noted that there have been no major constraints identified but they are currently undergoing landowner agreements on third party land to be used as part of the turbine delivery route. The prospective applicant briefly discussed the proposed turbine delivery route which will utilise the N62 and onto the R492.
- The Boards representatives recommended that the prospective applicant is clear on the potential rated output of the proposed development when requesting closure of the pre application consultation to ensure the Board can make the decision if the proposed development falls above the threshold for windfarm development under the 7th Schedule of the Act.
- The Boards representatives recommended that the prospective applicant consider migratory paths between nearby Special Areas of protection (SPAs) in any ornithological assessment undertaken as part of the proposal. They


recommended that the prospective applicant carry out a detailed collision risk assessment.

- The prospective applicant raised a query in relation to the design flexibility request which they intend on submitting to the Board. The Boards representatives clarified that they must request a consultation under section 37CC of the Act.
- The Boards representatives gave their preliminary opinion that the proposed development falls within the scope of strategic infrastructure but reminded the prospective applicant that the final decision lies with the Board.

Conclusion:

The Board's representatives advised that the onus is on the prospective applicant to either request a further meeting or formal closure of the instant pre-application consultation process. The Board's representatives advised that the record of the instant meeting will be issued in the meantime and that the prospective applicant can submit any comments it may have in writing or alternatively bring any comments for discussion at the time of any further meeting.

The Meeting concluded at 11:55.

The proposed Ballincor Wind Farm will comprise of 11 wind turbine structures with all associated infrastructure including turbine foundations, hardstanding areas, borrow pits, battery storage, access tracks and all other associated works including turbine delivery works and grid connection arrangements.

The purpose of the development is to generate renewable energy and the wind farm is estimated to provide between 61.6 – 77.0 MW of renewable electricity, which will be exported to the national grid, for use by households and businesses.

The exact make and model of the turbine cannot be confirmed prior to making the application as this will be dictated by a competitive tender process of the various turbines on the market at the time of procurement and Construction.

A certain degree of future-proofing and flexibility for turbines is required to ensure the most up to date technology can be deployed. This is necessary as the preparation of any wind energy application can require in excess of 2 years of environmental and ecological monitoring and surveying whilst the planning consent process itself can take in excess of 2 years.

Further, due to the complexity and nature of wind farm developments including the need for other processes to be completed such as the Grid Application Process with EirGrid, 10 year permissions are generally sought.
