Vigil to remember Adina will take place on Friday

A VIGIL is to be held in Portlaoise for Adina Raluca Constantin, who was the victim of a fatal assault in the town on Sunday 5 July.

The vigil will take place in Memorial Park on the Ridge Road at 6pm on Friday.

Niamh Ryan is one of the co-organisers of the vigil. A resident of Portlaoise for 17 years, Niamh previously organised a vigil in the same park for Ashling Murphy, the 23-year-old primary school teacher who was murdered in broad daylight.

"It was just something that I saw nobody else had done and so I had organised it off my own back," she says.

Niamh wanted to organise a similar vigil for Adina because "there has been a lot of outcry and just pure and utter shock that this has landed on our doorstep." She spoke to members of the community across various social media platforms and arranged to meet some of them. On 9 July, she met with Collette Doocey, Oonagh Duggan, cllr Caroline Dwane Stanley, as well as Adina's sister Dana and her best friend Adriana. They decided to arrange a vigil in Adina's memory.

"We want to do this very respectfully, in memory of Adina and, along with her family, to show her family that there is support there for her, for them and that the community are behind them," said Niamh.

According to the Women's Aid Femicide Watch for the

Republic of Ireland, eight women have died in violent circumstances so far in 2026. This number overtakes the recorded figure of seven women for the entirety of 2025.

The Women's Aid Femicide Watch shows that, in cases that have been resolved, 87 per cent of women killed were kill-

ed by a man known to them. On Tuesday 7 July, Adina's husband, Eugen Constantin (72), was charged with the

murder of his wife.

A day after Adina's death, the body of Jamey Carney was found in Killarney. She, too, had died in violent circumstances. Gardaí continue to investigate her death and are trying to locate a suspect who fled the country, whom they believe was known to the victim.

"I'd be very happy if people go home from the vigil and begin that conversation in their home. If they tell ten more people, that's another community, another family who starts that conversation and, hopefully, does something about this.

"We want to show the community, show her family that we're pulling together and that no other person needs to go through this and we want to involve media because we want to have these national conversations; to show that, whether it's happening in our community or in another community, that there are links, there is support, there is help out there for people who may have faced the same or are facing the same situation." Niamh hopes that through the vigil people will begin to understand Adina beyond the headlines. "Adina was a daughter, a sister, a friend, a co-worker, a neighbour, a community member," she says.

Originally from Romania, Adina had lived in Portlaoise for approximately 15 years. "In that time, she really settled into the community," says Niamh.

Machine guns and drugs worth over €700k seized in Laois and Kildare

MACHINE guns, pistols and drugs worth over €700,000 were seized in Laois and Kildare at the weekend. The raids were part of an ongoing investigation into organised crime in both counties, under Operation Tara.

Gardaí said on Sunday that an armed operation, targeting a number of individuals and locations in the Laois and Kildare areas, was put in place over the weekend of 10 - 12 July. Searches were carried out at six locations in Laois and Kildare, leading to the seizure of 11 military grade firearms made up of three machine guns and eight pistols.

Ammunition and silencers were also seized, together with heroin, cocaine and cannabis with an estimated street value of more than €700,000.

Two men, both aged in their 40s, were arrested and detained for questioning at garda stations in the midlands, under Section 50 of the Crimi-

The operation involved personnel attached to the Garda National Drugs and Organised Crime Bureau (GNDOCB), supported by personnel from the Garda Eastern Region, the Dublin Crime Response Team and the Emergency Response Unit. The firearms will be forwarded for technical examination by the Ballistics Section of the Garda Technical Bureau. The seized drugs will be forwarded to Forensic Science Ireland (FSI) for analysis. Gardaí said that investigations are ongoing following the raids. Assistant Garda Commissioner Angela Willis, head of Organised and Serious Crime, said: "The recovery of military-grade firearms, handguns and substantial quantities of illicit drugs has removed highly dangerous weapons and harmful substances from circulation, reducing the threat posed to the public and preventing significant criminal profits from being generated."

Proposed Upgrades to the Mortarstown Wastewater Treatment Plant and Kilkenny Road Pumping Station, Carlow, Co. Carlow

In accordance with Section 37E of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended, Uisce Éireann gives notice of its intention to make an application for a 10-year permission to An Coimisiún Pleanála in relation to the following proposed Strategic Infrastructure Development (SID) at the site of the existing Mortarstown Wastewater Treatment Plant (WwTP) and Kilkenny Road Pumping Station in the townlands of Mortarstown Upper and Carlow, Carlow Town, Co. Carlow.

In summary, the proposed development will consist of an upgrade to the existing Mortarstown WwTP, including the provision/refurbishment/demolition of various associated structures; decommissioning of existing Kilkenny Road Pumping Station; construction of a new inlet pump station at Mortarstown WwTP; construction of a new microtunnel gravity sewer along Kilkenny Road (R448) between the existing Kilkenny Road Pumping Station and the proposed new inlet pump station; construction of a new outfall chamber and outfall pipe including a microtunnel under the Kilkenny Road (R448); and landscaping, boundary treatment works, an upgrade to an existing borehole, and all ancillary site works above and below ground to facilitate the proposed development.

The existing Mortarstown WwTP has a treatment capacity of 36,000 population equivalent (PE). It is proposed to upgrade the WwTP to increase its treatment capacity to 58,500 PE.

The proposed upgrade to the WwTP will consist of the following:

- Microtunnel Gravity Sewer (785m in length) connecting the decommissioned Kilkenny Road Pumping Station to a new inlet Pump Station.
- New inlet Pump Station.
- Decommissioning of Existing Kilkenny Road Pumping Station.
- New Outfall chamber, Outfall Pipe including a microtunnel for the section crossing under the R448.
- Provision of various new structures at existing Mortarstown WwTP which comprise the following structures:
 - New foul pumping station for local agglomeration adjacent to existing inlet works (supplemented by standby generator).
 - New foul pumping tank and standby diesel generator to service the WwTP.
 - New fuel storage tank and 2 no. stormwater return pumps.
 - New primary settlement tanks and new primary sludge pumps.
 - Provision of 4 no. air blowers and modifications to existing air delivery pipework.
 - Provision of new air blower building and new bubble diffused air system.
 - Provision of 2 no. final settlement tanks with half-bridge scrapers.
 - Provision of new Return Activated Sludge (RAS) / Waste Activated Sludge (WAS) pumping station and station fitted with 2 no. RAS pumps and 2 no. WAS pumps.
 - Provision of 2 no. additional picket fence tank thickener.
 - Provision of 1 no. belt press, polymer prep unit and polymer dosing pumps.
 - Provision of new pumped sludge transfer system.
 - Provision of sludge import facility.
 - Provision of minimum 6 no. odour control units.
 - Provision of Mechanical, Electrical, Instrumentation, Control and Automation (MEICA) and Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) upgrades.
 - New storage shed and associated gantry.
- Refurbishment of the following structures at Mortarstown WwTP:
 - Structural refurbishment of picket fence tanks.
 - Mechanical and electrical refurbishment of existing picket fence thickener and conversion of second existing tank to a sludge blending tank.
 - Modifications to existing administration building.
- Demolition of the following structures:
 - Existing inlet works structure.
 - Existing storm tank.
 - Various small chambers within the site.
 - Existing sludge cake transfer facility.
- Decommissioning of the following plant/items:
 - Kilkenny Road Pumping Station.
 - Existing rising main.
 - Existing settlement tanks.
- The installation of ground-mounted photovoltaic (PV) solar panels.
- Diversion of existing ESB 38kV high voltage (HV) overhead lines and 10kV/20kV medium voltage (MV) overhead line on site (to be carried out by ESB).
- The proposed development will also consist of all site development, landscaping and boundary treatment works, an upgrade to an existing borehole; and all ancillary works above and below ground to facilitate the proposed development.

The Proposed Development will be constructed in the Carlow Town Agglomeration licenced under the Waste Water Discharge (Authorisation) (WWDA) Regulations 2007 (Discharge Licence No D0028-01). This application relates to a Proposed Development which requires a review of the existing WWDA Licence.

The planning application is accompanied by an Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) and Natura Impact Statement (NIS). - The likely significant effects of the proposed development on the integrity of a European Site, if carried out.
