The Facility is located at a site on Poolbeg Peninsula, Dublin 4, and is bounded to the north by Pigeon House Road, to the west by Shellybanks Road, and to the east by Ringsend Wastewater Treatment Plant.

An Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) has been prepared in respect of the proposed development. The Facility operates pursuant to an existing Industrial Emissions (IE) Licence (Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Ref. No. W0232-01).
