Please be advised that Dublin City Council intends to seek the approval of An Bord Pleanála for the following:

*To increase the capacity of the Dublin Waste to Energy Facility ("The Facility", An Bord Pleanála ref: PL29S.EF2022) from 600,000 tonnes per annum to 690,000 tonnes per annum.*

*The Facility is located at a site on Poolbeg Peninsula, Dublin 4, and is bounded to the north by Pigeon House Road, to the west by Shellybanks Road, and to the east by Ringsend Wastewater Treatment Plant.*

An Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) has been prepared in respect of the proposed development. The Facility operates pursuant to an existing Industrial Emissions (IE) Licence (Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Ref. No. W0232-01). This application relates to a proposed development which requires a review of the existing IE Licence which has been applied for separately to the EPA (EPA Ref. No. W0232-01). The Facility is not a Seveso site to which the Chemicals Act (Control of Major Accident Hazards Involving Dangerous Substances) Regulations SI 209 of 2015 applies.

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
