Replacement of 7No. manned level crossings on the main Dublin to Cork Railway Line – Section 47B request by Córas lompair Éireann to open mandatory pre-application consultation.

Dear Mr. Summers

I refer to the above proposed development and on behalf of Córas Iompair Éireann (CIÉ) request pre-application consultation with An Bord Pleanála (ABP) prior to submission of a Railway Order Application to eliminate/de-man 7No. Level Crossings on the Cork to Dublin Railway Line.

Location

It should be noted that 5No. of the Level Crossings are within the jurisdiction of Cork County Council and 2No. are within the jurisdiction of Limerick County Council. The crossings are located within a 15mile section of the line and straddle the Cork/Limerick County boundary.

Figure 1 (attached) provides the site locations for all of the existing level crossings, comprising:

- XC187 Fantstown (Co. Limerick):
- XC201 Thomastown (Co.Limerick);
- XC209 Ballyhea (Co.Cork);
- XC211 Newtown (Co.Cork);
- XC212 Ballycoskery (Co.Cork);
- XC215 Shinanagh (Co.Cork); and
- XC219 Buttevant (Co.Cork).

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Replacement of 7No. manned level crossings on the main Dublin to Cork Railway Line – Section 47B request by Córas lompair Éireann to open mandatory pre-application consultation.

Background

7No. manned level crossings are in operation on the Dublin to Cork Railway Line between Limerick Junction and Mallow Stations.

In 2010/2011 concept stage schemes were developed by CIÉ for overbridge schemes to eliminate/de-man each of the level crossings. However, the project was not progressed at that stage due to lack of funding.

In 2019 CIÉ undertook a feasibility study to investigate and appraise the options for the elimination/de-manning of the aforementioned level crossings. The options were then appraised using findings from a multi-criteria analysis and a preferred concept solution was identified for each of the level crossing.

Proposed Development

Following from the 2010/2011 concept stage schemes and the 2019 feasibility study, the options currently being considered for each of the sites include:

- 1) Closure of the level crossing;
- Provision of alternative access through the construction of an access road and/or overbridge; and
- 3) Upgrade to CCTV level crossing.

Jacobs has been instructed by CIÉ to review, refine and optimise the proposed solutions previously developed by CIÉ for each of the level crossing sites and is in the process of developing a preliminary design.

Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Railway Order Application

The Transport (Railway Infrastructure) Act 2001 (No. 55 of 2001) as amended, sets out the process required for making an application for a Railway Order. Section 37(2) lists the required documentation when making an application. This includes a requirement for:

'(e) a statement of the likely effects on the environment (referred to subsequently in this Part as an "environmental impact statement") of the proposed railway works.'

It is therefore a mandatory requirement to submit an Environment Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) with the Railway Order application.

EIA screening is not required however, scoping is necessary. On behalf of CIÉ, Jacobs is prepared a Scoping Report that will be submitted to ABP in advance of the Railway Order application.

Pre-Application Consultation

It is the purpose of this letter to request a pre-application consultation with ABP under Section 47B of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended). At this meeting, we will discuss the preliminary design for the proposed development and any planning and environmental issues that are emerging.



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The EIA Scoping Report is currently being prepared and it is proposed that the meeting takes place immediately after ABP is in receipt of the Scoping Report.

It is understood that the €4,500 fee for a pre-application consultation request has been paid directly to ABP on behalf of CIÉ by Mr Diarmuid Dunne of Iarnrod Eireann on the 2nd August 2019.


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Figure 1 - Site Location Plan
