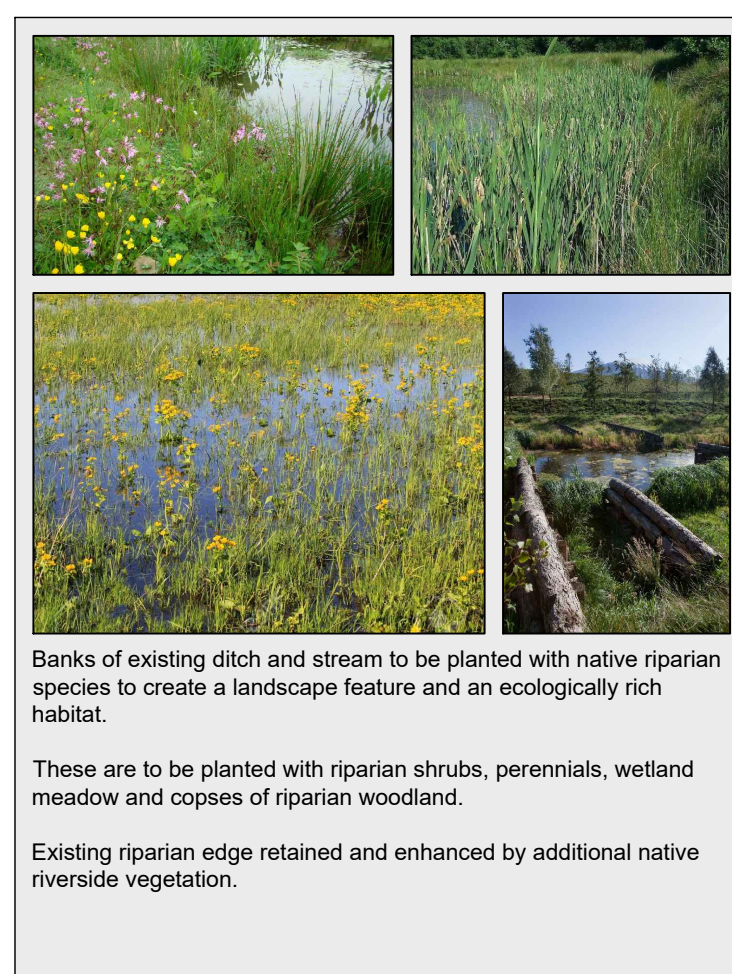

	Existing Tree To be protected, retained and incorporated into landscape scheme.
	Large Tree Planting To be planted as 4-6 stem, 3m, w.b. 4-4.5m high, 2m clear stem. To be of the following species: <i>Aesculus hippocastanum</i> (Horse Chestnut) <i>Fagus sylvatica</i> (Beech) <i>Quercus robur</i> (Oak) <i>Quercus petraea</i> (Oak) <i>Taxus baccata</i> (Yew)
	Medium Sized Street Tree Planting To be planted as 10-12cm girth specimens with underground growing system. To be selected from following: <i>Azalea trilobata</i> (Field Maple) <i>Prunus avium</i> (Wild Cherry) <i>Prunus cerasioides</i> (Ornamental Pear) <i>Prunus laurocerasus</i> (Ornamental Cherry) <i>Sorbus intermedia</i> (Strawberry) (Ausk Section)
	Small Trees Specimen Shrubs To be of the following species: <i>Aralia elata</i> , min 2 breaks, 3m, br. 3m, 1.25m clear stem <i>Amelanchier lamarckii</i> , feathered, min 2 breaks, 3m, w.b. 2.5-3m <i>Rhus typhina</i> , min 2 breaks, 3m, br. 4m, 1.2m clear stem <i>Corylus avellana</i> , feathered, min 2 breaks, 3m, w.b. 2.5-3m
	Existing Vegetation Hedge and scrub
	Proposed Hedge To unify existing hedges to perimeter
	Formal Hedge Planting To be selected from following: <i>Carpinus betulus</i> <i>Fagus sylvatica</i> <i>Ligustrum ovalifolium</i> <i>Prunus laurocerasus</i>

	Low Growing Native Woodland Mix To be planted as 20% 5-8cm leaf standards and 80% transparent. To be of the following species: <i>Crataegus monogyna</i> (Hawthorn) <i>Prunus spinosa</i> (Blackthorn) <i>Alnus aquatica</i> (Holly) <i>Fraxinus excelsior</i> (Ash) <i>Corylus avellana</i> (Hazel) <i>Sambucus nigra</i> (Elder)
	Stream Edge Meadow Mix To be planted as a wildflower meadow to improve the biodiversity of the local environment and reduce maintenance operations. <i>Devils Bit Scabious</i> - <i>Scilla pratensis</i> <i>Common Sorrel</i> - <i>Rumex acetosa</i> <i>Cuckoo Flower</i> - <i>Cardamine pratensis</i> <i>Comfrey</i> - <i>Prunella sp.</i> <i>Flaxbane</i> - <i>Erigeron</i> <i>Drumstick</i> - <i>Lactuca pedunculata</i> <i>Hemp Agrimony</i> - <i>Eupatorium cannabinum</i> <i>Lesser Knapweed</i> - <i>Centaurea nigra</i> <i>Marsh Cinquifol</i> - <i>Comarum palustre</i> <i>Marsh Marigold</i> - <i>Callitriche palustris</i> <i>Meadow Buttercup</i> - <i>Ranunculus acris</i> <i>Marsh Marigold</i> - <i>Callitriche palustris</i> <i>Meadow Rue</i> - <i>Thalictrum</i> <i>Ornithoglossum</i> - <i>Linum catharticum</i> <i>Purple Loosestrife</i> - <i>Lithospermum salicaria</i> <i>Ragwort</i> - <i>Lychnis viscaria</i> <i>Red Clover</i> - <i>Trifolium pratense</i>

	Feature Paving Feature large flag stone or textured concrete paving to seating areas
