Development:

Development will consist of; The application will seek permission to remove the existing grid connection works and for the development of the full length of a new grid connection over a distance of approximately 14.8km, between the existing Ballylicky ESB substation and the permitted Derreenacrinnig West Windfarm. The proposed development involves the following works: (a) removal of approximately 9.5 km of 20 kV overhead line (OHL) along the route, the OHL to be removed consists of 138 wood poles (ranging from 9m to 12.5m above ground), supporting electrical conductor lines and ancillary structures and equipment (b) following removal of the OHL, it is proposed to construct approximately 10.8 km of 20 kV overhead line (OHL) along the route, the OHL to be constructed consists of c. 157 wood poles (ranging from 9m to 12.5m above ground), supporting electrical conductor lines and ancillary structures and equipment. (c) installation of approximately 4 km of underground cable ducting and associated electrical cabling, and all other ancillary works including joint bays, culverts, marker posts and all associated developments. An Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) has been prepared and will be submitted to the planning authority with the application.

Derreenacrinnig West, Barnagowlane West, Glanareag Ards Beg, Ardrah, Laharanshermeen, Maulraha, Maulikeeve, Derryarkane, Cappanaboul, Skahanagh, Gortroe, Shandrum Beg, Shandrum More, Dromloughlin, Ballylicky, Crossoge, Co. Cork.

The Planning Authority is in receipt of an appeal reference ABP-315059-022 and letter dated 9th November 2022 from An Bord Pleanála in connection with the above. This includes the third-party appeal submission dated 9th November 2022 from Mr Ian Collins, Maulakieve Bantry, County Cork which it is observed extends to well over 39 pages + appendices and which at pages 38 and 39 in the submitted conclusions includes the view that "this whole affair has made a mockery of the planning process." The third party then through much misinformation draws attention to two enforcement/court cases at Leap in 2016 -2019 in relation to an unauthorised chapel building, seven pods, a two storey flat roofed meeting room (311 square metres) a steel container and unauthorised access (ENF Ref: SKB160020) as well as an unauthorised timber dwellinghouse (not the suggested extension) at Tragumna (ENF Ref: SKB190033 and ABP-306104-19) between 2019- 2022. Both of these cases resulted in successful prosecution and enforcement by the Planning Authority and with costs but both cases simply have no reference or relevance to this appeal and the development under consideration whatsoever.

The appeal application (Ref 21/00737) was submitted essentially following a legal challenge by Mr Ian Collins to the application for substitute consent that granted by An Bord Pleanela (ABP-305790-19) on the 9th June 2020 but quashed by a Judicial Review decision on the 8th March 2021 {2020-548JR}. The revised development as submitted under planning reference 21/00737 was carefully considered and followed detailed reports by the Area Planner (dated 16/12/2021 and 27/05/2022), Senior Executive Planner (dated 17/12/2021 and 27/05/2021 and 17/10/2022) and Senior Planner (dated 17/10/2022) after all the points made in the submissions were taken into consideration. Indeed, the Planning Authority required the application to be re-advertised given the "significant further information" received during the course of the application to even enable third party views to be taken into consideration further. The final report of the Senior Executive Planner (17/10/2022) in recommending permission subject to conditions had concluded that "all outstanding issues have been addressed" and that remains the case.

The third party has now submitted a voluminous 39 page statement + appendices and it is concluded that there is no matter of substance raised that has not already been addressed in this appeal submission, a blow by blow critique of each and every word serves no useful purpose.

It is not lost on the Planning Authority that the third party has submitted many other objections, as entitled to do, on many other windfarm developments elsewhere (see appendix) including those some considerable distance away. However, "Project Ireland 2040 and National Planning Framework" which offers national advice on windfarm development and climate change, and the 'Climate Action Plan 2021' and the 'Climate Action and Low Carbon Development (Amendment) Act 2021, amongst others, make for interesting reading as to the ultimate goals nationally.

This grid connection the subject of this appeal is necessary to enable the permitted windfarm development to actually result, since it is now over 10 years that the Derreenacrinnig West for seven turbines was permitted at appeal in 2012 subject to 16 conditions (PL 88.239767 - Ref 10/857) with a subsequent 'Extenuation of Duration' granted on 3rd May 2022 under planning reference 22/00153 with the parent permission ceasing to have effect after 29th April 2024.



The Planning Authority would simply re-affirm its decision to grant planning permission subject to the stated conditions consistent with national advice and awaits the outcome of this appeal.
