The proposed scheme consists of construction of bus and cycle infrastructure over an overall length of approximately 2.6 km on both sides of the River Liffey on Custom House Quay and North Wall Quay on the northside of the River Liffey, and on City Quay and Sir John Rogerson's Quay on the southside of the River Liffey, the provision of a new opening public transport bridge over the Dodder River from Sir John Rogerson's Quay to the R131 East Link Road at Ringsend, and a cycle track over a length of 1.1km from York Road, Ringsend, via Pembroke Cottages and Cambridge Park through Ringsend Park and along Strand Street and Pembroke Street, Irishtown, terminating at Sean Moore Road, all in the County of Dublin and within the Dublin City Council (DCC) administrative area.

The NTA has submitted to the Board the Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) prepared in accordance with section 50 of the Roads Act 1993 (as amended) and Directive 2011/92/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 December 2011 on the assessment of the effects of certain public and private projects on the environment as amended by Directive 2014/52/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 April 2014 in respect of the proposed road development. A Natura Impact Statement (NIS) has also been prepared and has been submitted to the Board in respect of the proposed road development under Part XAB of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended).
