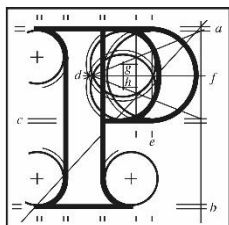

Moneypoint Generating Station is licensed by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under an Industrial Emissions (IE) Licence (Reg No. P0605-04). The proposed development includes works located entirely within the IE licenced boundary of Moneypoint Generating Station which is an Upper-tier establishment to which the Chemicals Act (Control of Major Accident Hazards Involving Dangerous Substances) Regulations 2015 (the COMAH Regulations) apply.

The planning application is accompanied by an Environmental Impact Assessment Report and Natura Impact Statement.

The planning application, Environmental Impact Assessment Report and Natura Impact Statement may be inspected free of charge or purchased on payment of a specified fee (which fee shall not exceed the reasonable cost of making such copy) during public opening hours for a period of seven weeks commencing on the 16 February 2024 at the following locations:

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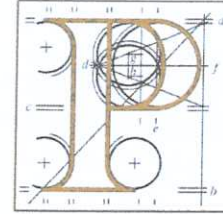

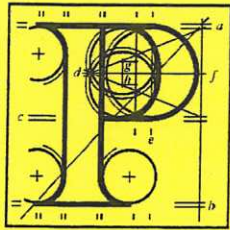
