APPENDIX 7 RECORD OF MONUMENTS AND PLACES

Entries in the Record of Monuments and Places in the Study Area

LH024-004001- Killineer Church

D-shaped graveyard to W of Killineer House. In centre is rectangular depression (max. dimes 14m by 4.5m), probably the church site. Church recorded as being ruinous in 1622, not rebuilt.

LH024-004002- Killineer Graveyard

D-shaped graveyard to W of Killineer House. In centre is rectangular depression (max. dims. 14m by 4.5m), probably the church site. Church recorded as being ruinous in 1622, not rebuilt.

LH024-004003- Killineer Font

A small font or stoup (LH024-041089-), now at the main door of St. Peter's Church (LH024-041004-) in Drogheda is thought to have come from Killineer graveyard.

LH024-010001- Mell Ritual site - holy well

Marked 'St. Patrick's Well' on the 1835 and the 1938 'OS 6-inch' maps. Covered over with a public pump when inspected by ASI in 1966.

LH024-01002- Mell Ritual site - holy well

Marked 'St. Patrick's Stone' on the 1835 and 1938 'OS 6-inch' maps. A large natural boulder with three circular depressions, which, according to tradition are the prints of St. Patrick's knees and staff.
