A7.8.1 INTRODUCTION

This appendix includes details of the qualifications and experience of the personnel involved in the ornithological surveys and assessment.

A7.8.2 TOM GITTINGS

The data analysis, including collision risk modelling, evaluation and assessment was carried out by Tom Gittings. The Environmental Impact Assessment Report chapter and appendices were written by Tom Gittings (excluding Appendices 7.3 – 7.6).

Tom Gittings has a BSc in Ecology, a PhD in Zoology and is a member of the Chartered Institute of Ecology and Environmental Management. He has 29 years' experience in professional ecological consultancy work and research. He has specific expertise in ornithological assessments for wind energy projects and has been involved in numerous wind energy projects. His input to these projects has variously included survey work, collision risk modelling, writing the ornithological sections of EIS, EIAR and NIS reports, expert witness services at oral hearings, and provision of scoping advice and peer review services.

A7.8.3 APEM

APEM carried out bird surveys in the summer of 2023, the winter of 2023/24 and the summer of 2024.

The APEM bird surveys were managed by Matthew Rea and Billy Gardener. The vantage point surveys were carried out by Paul Connaughton, Andre Robinson and Nick Veale. The breeding bird surveys were carried out by Marc Ruddock, who led the survey team, Jamie Bailey, Frank Connolly, Douglas Ruddock and Craig Swenarton.

Marc Ruddock has over 15 years' experience as a professional consultant, managing a team of surveyors to undertake surveys for a number of significant renewable and infrastructure projects. Marc has also delivered national Hen Harrier surveys, species introductions and contributed to statutory consultee guidance.

Paul Connaughton has over 7 years' experience as a consultant surveyor, but has been recognised as an expert field ornithologist for over 20 years. Paul has extensive experience of coastal, terrestrial, and marine ornithology surveys and currently works on a number of wind farm developments on the south and east coasts of Ireland. John Murphy is a senior ornithologist formerly of Malachy Walsh and Partners and was the Project Ornithologist at conception of this project. John Murphy was involved in setting the scope and design of the bird surveys for this site. He is very experienced having worked in the field of ornithology and ecology since 1982 and has extensive knowledge of the Irish landscape with regard to bird populations. He collaborates regularly with NPWS on different projects throughout the country. John is one of the country's foremost ornithologists and is a licensed bird ringer. He has always had an interest in wildlife photography and his work has been published in many magazines and books. Austin has coauthored the book "Shannon Airport Lagoon – A Unique Irish Habitat" and has worked on and contributed to the production of wildlife documentaries for WaxWing productions.

Ciaran Cronin has been an active naturalist and birdwatcher for over 30 years with a particular passion for birds. Working as a professional ornithologist and ecologist for over 20 years, Ciaran has a postgraduate qualification in 'Ecological Assessment' from University College Cork (1st Class Honours). Ciaran is a former member of the Irish Rare Birds Committee, an international





wildlife tour guide with National Geographic/Lindblad Expeditions and a trainer/assessor for the international ESAS seabird group. Ciaran is an expert in both bird and marine mammal identification and runs training courses in bird identification nationally.
