I have lived in Leamonaghan all my life and when Bord na Mona were milling peat during the summer months, we had to close all the windows in our house due to the high levels of dust that entered the house. It was a very unpleasant experience to have the windows closed in the house on hot summer days.

I could see the dust from the milled peat circulating in the air outside when the machines were working. In the evening time, when the dust settled, large amounts of dust were visible on window sills, garden furniture, cars and rooftops. I would obviously have inhaled some of this dust as there was no way of avoiding it.

I am extremely disappointed to learn that an organisation as big as Bord na Mona, would have carried out this work without appropriate permission.

I am strongly opposed to the granting of Substitute Consent under the provisions of Section 177E of the Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended) for peat extraction and ancillary works at Lemaghan Bog in the townlands of Cooldorragh, Kilnagaragh, Capanalallosset, Tumbeagh, Killanghintober, Castlearmstrong, Leabeg, Cornafurrish, Corrabeg, Lemaghan, Kilnagoolny, Strafudd, Lisdermot, Derrica More, Rosfaraghan, Rashinagh, Cor Mor, Cor Ber and Corbane, Co. Offaly in relation to the above Case Number.
