





Hello, I would like to register our observations of why we believe this should not go ahead.

- 1. Public Health and Safety
- 2.
- a. Child Safety
 - The number of young children in the area has increased in recent years and there are now lots of different ages using the roads and green area that is under review.
 - ii. By opening this wall, you are exposing these young children to a major dual carriage way which will risk serious injury.
 - iii. This will also open the access to a cul de sac and there are further risks to children to antisocial behaviour and potential other unwanted risks.
 - iv. These children will lose their play area, and also now be exposed to more toxic air and noise pollution from the major dual carriageway
- b. Increased Anti-Social Behaviour
 - i. The Ayrfield area is insulated from some anti-social behaviour as it is limited to 1 main access point. By opening this wall, we would be exposed to a much wider area where criminals can access the area, and use this as a rat run for criminal activity. The area has experienced a reduction in criminal activity over the years and by introducing a new access point we feel this would seriously increase the risk of Crime, Theft, break ins and robberies.
 - ii. This in conjunction with the use of electric scooters and scramblers would provide criminals and excellent route to escape and run from the Garda.
 - iii. I have experienced this in my Neighbours house, were we ended up chasing the robbers with Garda support. This seriously impacted our elderly Neighbours as they were afraid to live in their house
- c. Risk to community
 - The Ayrfield area has built up a small community and there is a good relationship in the area. The area is kept extremely well by the community, and there are lots of tidy up initiatives and gardening.
 - ii. By adding the new access point, we believe people will use this as a "Rat Run" and park cars so they can access the bus. There is nothing illegal in people doing this, so the residence would not be able to stop them.
 - iii. There could be a mass exit of people from the area due to this change.
- d. Increase Noise and Air Pollution
 - i. This is a major dual carriage way that runs 24/7 busses, Taxi, and HGV.

 The residences is some what protected from the noise and dirt from the road by the wall.

e. Public Space

- i. This area is used by the children to play, and as there are a lot of young children this is one of the first green areas, they are allowed play in, so it is close to the house. Other green areas at the front of the estate are too far.
- ii. The area has been used on many occasions by the residence

This is not something that the residence of the area want to have, We are happy to walk a little further to the bus or train rather than risk the lives of the children in the area and make this area unsafe for young and old.
