





We wish to place an objection for the proposed work on the open space between 45 & 47 Ayrfield Drive. My reasons for such a strong objection to this proposal are as follows:

#### 1. Public Health and Safety:

For the past 40 years, I have been a resident on Ayrfield Drive. The green space on Ayrfield Drive has always been used by the families and their children as a safe and secure recreational play area. It has also been used as a space to build a sense of community within our area which is an integral part of society as a whole. It has been a safe space for all to use without fear of any accidents happening. Should this proposal be successful, children and families would not be safe to play in the location. There would be increased cyclists, motorists, electric scooters and the likes, resulting in high risk to harming and seriously injuring members of this community, especially the young children who don't have road awareness. Furthermore, based on the proposal, children will have easy access to a dual carriageway which is a significant concern of ours due to risk it will bring to the location.

#### 2. Anti-Social Behaviour:

Since 1979 when the estate was first established, there has only ever been one entrance/exit to Ayrfield/Rathvale housing estate. This brought great

comfort to the residents, knowing that anyone in the estate was a guest or a resident themselves. Creating this opening onto the Malahide Road, causes social concerns regarding the safety of houses, cars, belongings etc. as it gives people engaging in anti-social behaviour an easy option to abscond the Guards. This estate takes great pride in their community. It has a very low crime rate as it stands due to the safety that this wall offers to them. Taking this protection away from the community is a direct invitation for individuals to engage in anti-social and criminal behaviour in the estate.

#### 3. Impact on Community

Within Ayrfield/ Rathvale, the community have utilised the green spaces in the area to educate and inform young children about the importance of biodiversity. In the green spaces mentioned, the residents have created ecosystems for the natural wildlife in the area, further supporting the importance of sustainability in the wider community.

#### 4. Traffic Hazards:

Should this proposal be successful, the implications on traffic in the area will be significant. Firstly, the volume of traffic in the area will increase. The roads as they are wouldn't support this influx of traffic. Secondly, parking will be a serious issue as there are insufficient spaces to support the volume of people wanting to use the bus connect service on the Malahide Road. This directly impacts the people of Ayrfield Drive as non-residential motorists etc. will park their car using residential facilities/spaces outside their homes. This impacts people with wheelchairs, parents of young children with buggies, the elderly and those with mobility issues and additional needs who need space by their homes. Thirdly, the volume of cars will definitely result in an accident involving a child running from

behind/in between parked cars to cross the road. This can be avoided by not building the planned proposal.

#### 5. Litter

As mentioned previously in this objection, the people of Ayfrield have a great sense of community and pride in their area and look after the presentation of the estate. For example, regularly cutting grass verges, planting flowerbeds and sweeping the kerbs. There is also a residence association who look after the upkeep of the area. Increased volume of people who don't reside here can result in the degradation of the area through littering as they disembark from the bus or whilst they wait at the bus stop. This can be seen already at bus stops along the Malahide Road.
